PARENTS' NOTES:

- We're off to a great start! Please remember that drop-off is between 8:45 and 9:00 each morning. At drop-off, please drop-off from the left side of the drive lane and park in one of the coned spaces in the right lane if you want to walk your child in.
- **The drop-off/pick-up area is a "no cell phone zone" and a "hand-holding zone."**
- With the autumn weather comes jackets and coats. Please make sure that your child brings appropriate outerwear for the cooler days ahead. We do go outside every day unless it is raining. It helps us tremendously if jackets are labeled with names.
- **OOPS!** Remember that tuition is due by the fifth of each month. Please place tuition payments in the little red schoolhouse located outside of my office, mail it in, or leave it in the church office mail slot marked "Preschool."
