# Message From the Pastor

## **Trading Spaces**

We have spent the summer trading spaces. Frankly, it has been refreshing to me. Sometimes changing the routine is good. When we worshipped in Tartan Hall at the later service, we were squeezed in like sardines. I had to put my arm around the person next to me as we sat so close. I looked out and saw a cozy community, a band of disciples ready to be open to what was happening. I am so thankful. Our leaders have identified a couple of needs of our congregation. The newly renovated spaces will have some gathering spaces for folks to sit and visit. Our Fellowship Ministry is working on some short term Wednesday dinners and programs later in fall. And then on Sunday we will add time between services and "The Bridge" for us to have unrushed time to gather.

generosity, and love; and reaches beyond Sunday morning, encouraging children to live their lives as an expression of God's grace.



## **Bridges to Worship for Second Graders**




Beginning in January children in second grade will explore worship practices through *Get Ready! Get Set! Worship!* In their Bridgeport they will learn about the order of worship, the

# From the Finance Ministry

Through June, total income was \$466,604 while expenses for the first half of 2015 were \$422,968 for a surplus of \$43,636. Overall expenses are at 45.5% of budget, while income is at 50.2%. As you can see, income is slightly above budget while expenses are 4.5% below budget. Session ministry chairs are doing a great job of managing expenses, and thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community and around the world.

**Bridging Generations Update:** Pledge giving for the month was \$130,837. Non-pledge giving was \$903, undesignated memorial gifts was \$170 and interest income was \$1.92 for a total of \$131,911.20. Total income year to date is \$205,282.60.
