## Choir Corner

Many of you have probably heard the saying, "things — they is a-changing". With changes come newness, freshness, improvement, fear, excitement... The list can go on and on. And how changes affect us is really in our perceptions. I know that I become a little anxious when life provides changes even when I know it is for the better. And it's easier to handle life changes when we see them coming and not to be blind-sided by them.

Lots of planning and preparation have made for changes around the Fort this fall. We get to settle in to updated and remodeled areas of the church in our education building in which the choir room space has been relocated; the sanctuary has been opened up at the front with the pulpit more "up close and personal", mose space to move around and allow versatility in our set-up: for example, our guest instrumentalists and others don't have to be as confined and tightly squeezed into a small area; the organ and piano can move out of the corner so that Judy and the choir are able to hear each other better; the choir loft space has been enlarged and repositioned in such a way that we are singing out into the room more and the basses on the back row aren't in the dark anymore (well, that may not speak for all of them — HA!). There are panels built in to provide better acoustics and throw the sound out into the room. In my opinion, all of these things are positives for us musically. And now you can't say you aren't singing in the choir because there's no room in the loft!!! There have always been places we could spread out and add a chair, but now there truly is more physical space. No more excuses!! Now is the time to come forth out of the pews and sing. You don't know what you are missing!

There will also be some schedule changes in the musical opportunities offered for all who want to share their gifts, learn through and with music, and to become involved with wonderful groups of people of all ages.

For our young people, choirs will be offered for children and youth in grades K—8<sup>th</sup> grade on a different day and time. The rehearsals will <u>move to Wednesdays</u> beginning on Wednesday, September 9. Kindergarten—3<sup>rd</sup> grade will rehearse from 6:15—6:45 and 4<sup>th</sup> grade—8<sup>th</sup> grade will rehearse from 6:45—7:15. Later in the fall in October, a meal, recreation time, and an opportunity for adults of all ages will be offered. Plan now to plug your children/youth into a fun and wonderful learning opportunity. 

## Racism Study

Racism. No one can deny it exists yet talking frankly about it is one of the few remaining taboos of contemporary society. We often feel like we've come a long way in regard to race relations and we hear myths such as "I'm colorblind" or "Anyone can achieve the American dream if they just work hard enough." However, while we have made some advances



toward racial equality, we still have much work to do. This eleven-session adult study on racism in America is designed to help start faithful, honest, and freeing conversations about race and racism.

This study provides a tour through the biblical and historical realities of race and racism as a foundation for asking difficult yet necessary questions about where we stand today — and where we must go from here.

The first session in the study acknowledges that racism is difficult to talk about even as it opens up some avenues for interaction that make the conversation easier. In other sessions, participants will come to understand terms such as race,

ethnicity, power, privilege, and culture within the context of conversations about racism. Key concepts that are often misunderstood such as white privileges and the insidious nature of its impact on society will be explored.

Participants will also take a closer, more focused look at the issues of affirmative action and consider the cultural ramifications of segregated churches. Also included is a substantive and enlightening four-session study on the history of racism in America from 1492 to the present. And we'll go even further back in history with a look at the racism in the Bible, where differences were more likely to be based on culture rather than on color.

Study titles include: "Why Is It So Difficult to Talk About Racism?", "Racism 101", "The Bible and Racism", "A History of Racism in the United States", "White Privilege", "Is Affirmative Action Still Needed", and "Do Segregated Churches Imply Racism?".



We will be staying at El Faro and going out to the nearby Guatemalan villages to assist the families there. Trip leader Beth Chapman and her twelve team members are busily preparing Blessing Bags to take with them to Guatemala for 30 children and 30 adults. If you would like to participate, there are opportunities for donations and "hands-on participation" for you, young and old alike. Included in the Blessing Bags will be items like tissues, band-aids, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, comb, brush, paper, pen, pencils, socks, and snacks.

Our Mission Outreach committee met August 13 to prepare for our church's upcoming mission trips for the coming year. Presently, we have both medical and non-medical teams assembling.

## Helping Hands

Helping Hands is a foster home and emergency shelter for abused and neglected children.

The program accepts children who have been taken into care by the SC Department of Social Services, the majority of whom come from Anderson, Greenville, Oconee, and Pickens Counties. The children, ranging in age from birth to twelve years old, may be with Helping Hands as little as overnight or up to a year or more. One hundred percent of the children in residence receive a safe place to live, healthy meals, clothing, access to healthcare (including mental health), and access to education.

The Shelter can care for up to 54 children at a time (almost 30 children are in residence today) and has cared for more than 8,000 children since opening the doors. To put this in context, about 800 children are placed in emergency foster care each year — and over 100 of them are served by Helping Hands!

Helping Hands is in the process of building a larger shelter in Pendleton to move from its current location in Six Mile. Donations are greatly appreciated and can be made at <u>http://helpinghandsofclemson.org/</u> <u>donations/</u>. ## From the Finance Ministry

Through July, total income was \$529,965 while expenses for the first seven months were \$479,269 for a surplus of \$50,696. Overall expenses are at 51.6% of budget while income is at 57%. As you can see, income is approximately 1% below budget while expenses are 6.5% below budget. Session ministry chairs are doing a great job of managing expenses, and thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.
