Why Don't We Sing Christmas Carols Earlier?



Christmas is on December 25 and the twelve days following ending with Epiphany. In the weeks before Christmas Christians experience Advent — a season of waiting, watching, preparing, longing.

I know those are not popular verbs in our world today.

- Waiting? "I want it now!"
- Watching? "I want to get in the game."
- Preparing? "Ready-to-go meals, no-assembly-required toys, and relationships-without-work are what I want."
- Longing? "I want a quick fix. I'll fill that emptiness with too much stuff, alcohol, Netflix."

Truth is we need Advent. Jesus has come and is coming again. But in the meantime, we live as expectant people, looking for God's hand at work among us. Our Scriptures in the weeks leading to Christmas Incarnation are about repentance, relying on God, working for peace, hoping for renewal, love in the flesh, and deep and abiding joy. From the Finance Ministry

Through October, total income was \$761,727 while expenses were \$760,349 leaving a surplus of \$1,378. Overall expenses are at 81.3% of budget, while income is at 81.5%. Sharing the Good News

Throughout our faith journey, we all find ways to live out Fort Hill's mission in our community and around the world. Sometimes we purposefully search out ways, other times it seems, opportunities un-expectantly find us! Such was the case when I recently learned that the School District of Pickens County was teaming with the YMCA in Easley and Pickens to bring a top-notch mentoring program to area schools. The stated goal read, "to provide a framework of support to help students achieve their potential and discover their strengths". The timing was right for me to delve a bit further. Through Mentoring 101 classroom training and online courses, I learned some eye-opening statistics:

- In Pickens County, 51.4% of our students are on free and reduced meal plans, while 57.6% of students are living in poverty (based on other factors besides free and reduced meals).
- 6.9% are classified as homeless. With a student population of 16,400, that is over 1,100 students.
- Although accurate information is not available at the District-level, we do know that 41% of students in South Carolina live in single parent homes.

The need is evident, for awareness...for action...for you and me!

The belief of the Y-Mentor Program is that, "change happens through one-on-one relationships". Through YMCA communications and training, I learned that the primary focus of mentoring is not tutoring, though it can be incorporated. The 3 basic principles of mentoring are **LOVE**, **MODEL**, **& COACH**. Cindy Perry, Y Mentor Director for Pickens County states, "You may not change the entire world by this one mentoring relationship, but for the child/ teen, you have changed their world!" At this point in the fact gathering process, I was thinking, "OK, I can do this, I can give my time once a week to meet with my student at the school, and see where it all leads". But then, I received a communication from the program. It was part of a weekly education/pep talk, that arrives to my e-mail in-box each Monday morning. This one began:

Mentoring Reminder of the Week: Meeting Human Needs

There are human needs in the children we serve being met by having a friend, an encourager, and an advocate on their side to help them walk through life...

Epiphany! **Fort Hill engages in the shared vision of this life-changing program!** Review our mission and faith practices to identify the various links. Now, I've progressed from fact-finding to "all in". I invite you to pray for my new friend at Clemson Elementary School and our time together. The biggest thing the Y Mentor program asks of its mentors is commitment. New mentors make a 1-year commitment of 30 minutes per week, but the hope is that you'll renew that commitment to follow along with your student through their school years. There is an additional, optional layer of the program, called Outside Mentoring, which allows a mentor to take their mentee with their family to a ball game, amusement park, or even to church. As a new mentor, I'm taking things one day at a time, with an open heart and mind and hopefully, the prayerful support of Fort Hill's congregation.
