Message From the Pastor Sabbatical Summer

Dear Friends,

"Faith is a journey without maps," wrote Frederick Beuchner. This summer we will be on a special kind of journey, a Sabbatical. Sabbaticals are times for rest, reflection, and growth for both the pastor and the congregation. The Clergy Renewal Grant poses this question, "What will make your heart sing?"

My response: I will be on a pilgrimage of faith this summer connecting with God, building relationships, learning, and reflecting. For hundreds of years, Christian Communities have practiced the faith following a "Rule of Life" like that of Benedict. Christian Communities order their daily life around the work, worship, and practices of faith in order to grow together as God's faithful people and to serve. So part of my pilgrimage will involve some travels to Christian Communities which practice a "Rule" somewhat like our Fort Hill Faith Practices. I will take a personal pilgrimage to Iona Abbey in Scotland — an ecumenical worshipping and working faith community on the west coast of Scotland. Iona was founded in 563 by Columba, an Irish monk and his 12 companions, who brought the Christian faith to the British Isles. The ancient pilgrims would walk from Iona to Holy Island in Northern England to retrace the steps of how the faith spread from one coast to the other under the missionary Aiden. I will go to Holy Island as part of my journey. Coincidentally, my Grandfather Wearmouth was born in this region near Durham before immigrating to the U.S. as a child. I will walk where thousands of other pilgrims have walked, prayed, and wrestled for a blessing from God.

I plan to spend time with a contemporary Christian group called the Northumbria Community while there. From there I will travel east to Wales to the Gladstone residential library for reading, reflection, and synthesis before meeting up with my family for another leg of the pilgrimage which includes Paris, Chartres, Geneva (John Calvin), Provence, and Florence. Through art, culture, cathedrals, nature, and history, we will enjoy the good gifts God has given us.

Prior to that big pilgrimage, I will spend some time working with Anna Carter Florence, the Peter Marshall Professor of Preaching at Columbia Theological Seminary. We are planning a week at the beach with some friends. And much of the last month will be spent preparing Avery and Hallie (and their parents) for return to college. Chuck and I will begin to learn the meaning of "empty nest!"

Our Clergy Renewal Grant provides for opportunities for both of us in this special time. Our congregation is provided with funds for part-time supply pastor for the summer and a leadership retreat for session. Session and Personnel are working on providing that leadership.

Thank you, Fort Hill Church, for this time of refreshment in faith, family, and friendships in God's big beautiful world.



Every year before the Christian Passover (Easter) we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Inside the "Den" A Weekend of Service and Reflection

Most folks may not have noticed our band of 7 confirmands and 3 adults who gathered in the church parking lot on a rainy Friday afternoon. It was the beginning of MLK Weekend, and we set off for Charlotte to take part in CROSS Missions' Weekend Experience. This was our first trip together as a confirmation class, and none of us knew quite what to expect!

We spent Saturday morning working with Beds for Kids, where we vacuumed furniture, moved couches, and prepared new mattresses for children who have no bed or perhaps no furniture at all in their rooms. Then we visited a 24/7 prayer room, where we were able to pray for neighbors and strangers, locals and folks from faraway places.

That afternoon we visited a home that provides care for people experiencing homelessness who have recently been released from the hospital. We baked them warm cookies, drank lemonade with them, and played roaring games of Jenga, Heads-Up, and Apples to Apples!

I was deeply moved by the compassion of these 8th graders. As we reflected on our day of serving, it was amazing to hear what they observed. They marveled at what a difference a lamp would make for a child's learning when he or she received furnishings from Beds for Kids. They were delighted to discover how people experienced homelessness share a lot in common with us: they love to laugh and play games and eat cookies like we do!

It was yet another time where God reminded me just how far God's Kingdom stretches outside the church's walls. God is at work in warehouses and prayer rooms and recovery homes, too!

2017 has come to a close, and was another successful year for Fort Hill. Total income through year end was \$951,863 while expenses were 918,599 leaving a surplus of \$33,264. Overall expenses ended at 98% of budget, while income finished at 102%. As you can see, income was slightly above budget while expenses were 2% below budget. Session ministry chairs did a great job of managing

expenses, and your continued generosity led to the budget surplus. 2018 will bring continued and new financial challenges, so your sustained support is needed for Fort Hill for its ministries to members, community, and around the world.
