This may be your mission, should you choose to accept it.

Third, thank you. Being with you has warmed my heart and strengthened my soul for this adventure of living in the Way of Jesus. I'm so glad our pathways intersected and we are forever linked in this life's journey. May God bless you as you have blessed me. Peace be with you fellow pilgrims, peace be with you.

Communion Preparation

Have you ever wondered how the bread and juice for 10:45 communion gets to the table every month?

You might not realize there is a Communion Team of a few volunteers who rotate throughout the year to make sure communion goes as smoothly as possible. We are now in need of a few more volunteers on our team and are hoping a few of you have the time to help out about three weekends a year. Communion months alternate between intinction and trays, so here's a brief description of what's involved for each one.

Intinction Service — Prep work involves purchasing the juice and bread loaves. Whole loaves of bread are wrapped for the choir, balcony, and front stations; chalices are filled with juice. After service is over communion items are taken back to the sacristy, plates and chalices are cleaned, and linens taken home to wash and iron for the next month. *Pottery pitcher, chalices, and plates are used for the intinction services.

Traditional Tray Service — Prep work involves purchasing the juice and gluten free bread is cubed and placed on silver trays, juice poured in individual cups. Stacks of silver trays are placed on the table in the front. After service is over communion items are taken back to the sacristy, silver items wiped clean, linen taken home to wash and iron for the next month. *Silver pitcher, chalice, and stacking tray set is used for the traditional tray service.

The Communion Team is currently Beth & Jerry Chapman, Robin Denny, Pam & Jerry Waddle, Lauren Young, and Suzan Simmons.

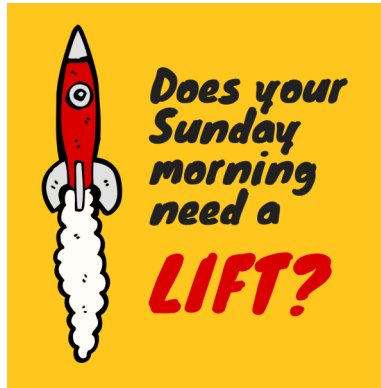

All last year, we changed the format of our youth bridge time so that we could invite in speakers each month to share about why faith was important to them. It gave our youth a chance to connect with an adult in the church that they perhaps didn't already know all that well.

We also started doing once-a-month trivia, and I found that the real key to success was in letting our adult leaders play *with* the youth! God was doing something new and exciting during our bridge hour. It took me far too long to realize that the answer was right in front of us the whole time!

Multiple generations of disciples were coming together, not as teacher and student, but as co-disciples who got to play games, share their faith, and explore God's Word — not to mention enjoy the Dunkin' Donuts that the Martins brought for us each week!

In one sense, LIFT is an all-new way for disciples of all ages to gather together on Sunday mornings to do these exact things: share our faith, explore God's Word, enjoy recreation and maybe even a few donuts! But in another sense, it's something God has already been working on with us over the past year in youth ministry. And now it's time for us to share it with the whole family of faith at Fort Hill.

I hope you'll join us and be ALL-IN for LIFT. If this past year is any indication, you might be surprised where God takes you!

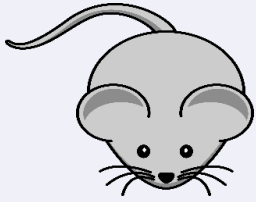

From the Finance Ministry

Through July, total income was \$528,367 while expenses for the first seven months were \$542,352 leaving a deficit of \$13,985.

Expenses are at 56% of budget, while income is at 54.5%. As you can see, income and expenses are below budget. Income during summer months is typically low, but July giving was unusually low so please review your pledged giving to eliminate this shortfall!

Bridging Generations Update:

Pledged giving for the month was \$6,236.66. Non-pledged giving was \$3,089, undesignated memorial gifts were \$70 and interest income was \$1.05. All giving combined gave a total of \$9,396.71 for the month.

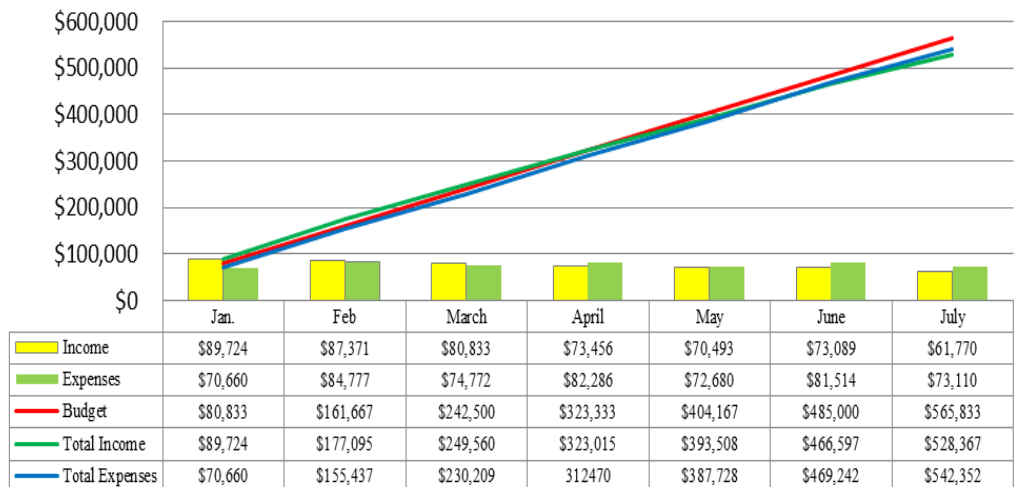

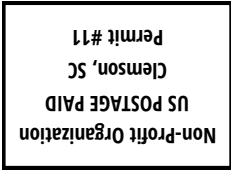

Mission Statement: An organization is to assist persons in difficult circumstances with necessities such as food, shelter and utilities, and to help them to become self-sufficient through educational programs and advocacy. Located at 105 Anderson Highway in Clemson, Clemson Community Care serves the Clemson, Central, and Pendleton communities.

Clemson Community Care (CCC) was established in 1988 by ministers of various denominational churches in Clemson, Central, and Pendleton as a non-profit charitable corporation to serve the local community and is a partner agency with both Pickens County United Way and Anderson County United Way. The organization's services are comprised of food programs, utilities and rental assistance, children's programs, and social referral services. Individuals, churches, civic groups, and businesses have generously donated to CCC so that:

- 90 seniors received food boxes each month
- 122 children were outfitted with school supplies
- 583 families avoided utility disconnect
- 1,724 families received food
- 250 children received toys for Christmas
- 363 families received holiday food
- 69 families avoided eviction
