That love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love (like God) never ends.



From the Finance Ministry

2015 has come to a close, and was another successful year for Fort Hill. Total income through year end was \$934,252, while expenses were \$845,424 for a surplus of \$88,828. Overall expenses ended at 91% of budget, while income finished at 100.5%. As you can see, income was slightly above budget while expenses were 9% below budget. Session ministry chairs did a great job of managing expenses, and not being fully staffed led to the budget surplus. 2016 will bring continued and new financial challenges, so your sustained support is needed for Fort Hill to continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.

Bridging Generations Update: Pledge giving for the month was \$157,568.87. Non-pledge giving was (\$9,210.41), undesignated memorial gifts were \$50 and interest income was \$9.90 for a total of \$148,418.36. Total income year to date is \$892,194.87. Total expenses year to date: \$1,852,656.49.

Fort Hill Medical Mission and Mission Outreach Update

Fort Hill Missions now include medical (Fort Hill Medical Mission) and non-medical (Mission Outreach) efforts. The mission ministry which oversees these efforts is made up of the following members: Mary Barron, Raenota Merrill, Marlene Nicholas, Larry Sloan, Jim London, Chuck Conrad, Beth Chapman, Art Williams, and Eddie Payne with the following members now rotating off: Cathy Spragins, Bill Beckwith, and Bob Brown. I want to personally thank each one of these very dedicated individuals who care so deeply about those who suffer needlessly.

The first mission of 2016 will be a medical one, traveling to El Faro, Guatemala from February 19 to March 5. For Fort Hill Medical Mission this is trip number 40. Just as a quick summary, since 1998 the following countries have been visited, many on multiple occasions:

El Faro is a mission located on the eastern coast of Guatemala, in the Izabal state. It is a non-denominational mission which was established 10 years ago by a Christian Chicago businessman. In April 2013, Fort Hill first visited El Faro, taking eye surgery there for the first time. Since then we have returned 4 additional times, the last one being a very successful non-medical mission trip in October 2015. To say that El Faro is unique in its outreach is a significant understatement. Everyone who has been there loves the place and its missionaries and the people it serves.

The upcoming trip will be very special. For the first week, we will work out in the villages as part of a general medical/dental campaign. Hundreds of people will come for care of various kinds and will be served with graciousness and love. The second week will be for eye surgery, and we will be working in a brand new eye surgery as this all got started back in April 2013. Yes, the impact of that is a very powerful one for all of us at Fort Hill. Thank you for your prayers as we prepare and as we depart and serve.

The missions of Fort Hill would not be possible without the heart of Fort Hill plowing the ground. Without Fort Hill's encouragement and support, it would all have been dead in the water. You have done this and for you I send tons of thanksgiving to our Lord. Every life we touch — you are touching. And I thank you all.
