Message From the Pastor

Welcome Aboard Cyndi Davis, Children's Ministry Coordinator

With much enthusiasm the search committee, chaired by Terri Bruce, recommended Cyndi Davis to serve in this new part-time position to assist our children in growing as faithful disciples. You may know Cyndi as the smiling face, quietly serving, teaching, and worshipping at Fort Hill. She begins her work on September 2. She has dedicated her life to the welfare and development of youth, children, and families. Cyndi is an elder and deacon in the Presbyterian Church (USA). She has been an active member serving as a member of Fellowship Ministry, Youth group leader, Sunday School teacher, Cub Scout leader, and as chair of the Christian Education Ministry team at Fort Hill Church. She also has served as a Co-coordinator for our area Special Olympics.



She also brings much professional experience to bear. Cyndi has worked as manager of *Learning Safari*, an educational resource store, for 16 years. When we first arrived at Fort Hill, Chuck and I were drawn to Don and Cyndi, in particular, for the way they exemplify faithful Christian parenting. We are excited that Cyndi will not only be a faithful witness to our children, but to all of us as we grow in faith in Christ together. The Coordinator for Children's Ministry works part-time to support the worship, service and nurture of children. In fact, Cyndi was already working before she was hired to help us remember children who need school supplies as we brought our backpacks to worship last week filled with goodies to share. We donated these supplies to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to help children in hard-hit communities.

Thank you to our wonderful search committee. If you see Terri Bruce, Erica Hays, Raenota Merrill, Paul Russell, and Mary Morrison, please give them a "holy high five!" That's a thing. Fort Hill is in good hands with such faithful leadership. I know God is doing great things. Mr. Eugene Rogers Goodwyn III (Gene)



Born April 9, 1941 in Atlanta, Georgia, Gene was the only child in a family headed by his dad, a Federal Bureau of Prisons employee, and his mom, a homemaker. Gene earned degrees from Presbyterian College, the University of Virginia, and the University of Georgia and taught high school math for 30+ years. He served in the US Army as a Commissary Officer in Orleans, France with a Reserve Officer's Commission for 2 years. An avid canoe camper in his youth, Gene logged over 1,500 miles on rivers from Florida to British Columbia and led the first National Sierra Club Outing in the Southeast, a canoe trip through Okefenokee Swamp and down the Suwanee River in 1970. As a member of the Atlanta Tennis Umpire's Association,

he served 10 years as a USTA Referee and Chair Umpire officiating at numerous collegiate and junior tournaments in Georgia and South Carolina.

In 1971 while teaching in Atlanta, Gene was named a STAR Teacher by the Georgia Chamber of Commerce. In 1987 he was nominated as National High School Tennis Coach of the Year while coaching teams at Seneca High. A member of Kiwanis International for 35 years, Gene served 3 terms as President of the Seneca Kiwanis Club and was instrumental in establishing the Terrific Kids' Project in 5 Oconee County elementary schools.

Gene met Carol, his lovely wife to be, on the internet in 2003 and they were married on May 1, 2004. On January 19, 2006, Gene and Carol became members of FHPC and served in Home Bound Missions for 4.5 years. Gene also served as a Shepherd for 12 sheep for 6 years. Gene logged over 500 miles annually for several years transporting indigents to the food bank and to doctors' appointments through the "Gopher Project" of Seneca Presbyterian Church. Gene's favorite past-time is helping to recruit good students to PC and he has 27 to his credit.

Life Line Screening, a leading provider in community-based preventative health screenings, will host their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings on October 13, 2014, in Tartan Hall.

As many of you may not know, stroke is a leading cause of death today, affecting over 750,000 people each year. Every 45 seconds in America, someone suffers a stroke, and every 3 minutes someone dies from one. This means that during the time it will take you to read this, approximately 15 people in the United States will have died due to a stroke. Stroke can change your life, but it can also take your life.

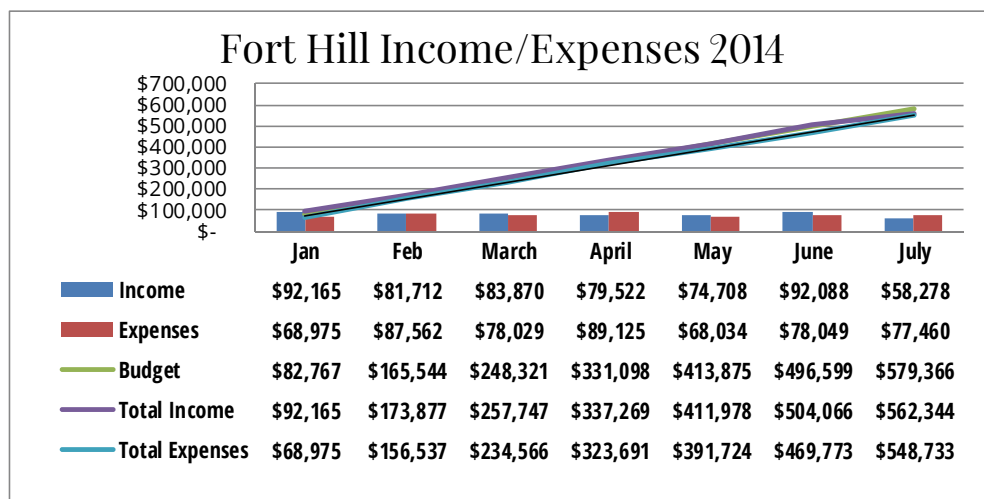
Please consider taking part in these potentially life-saving screenings. We are happy to announce that Life Line Screening is working with us to provide our members a \$10 additional discount off of a screening package in addition to giving a \$10 donation to Fort Hill Presbyterian Church. If you would like to take the next step in possibly saving your life or the life of someone you know, please take advantage of this offer.

Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to blocked arteries, abdominal aortic aneurysms, hardening of the arteries in the legs, and atrial aortic fibrillation or irregular heart beat. A bone density screening for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis, will also be offered. All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.

From the Finance Ministry

Through July, total income was \$562,344 while expenses for the first seven months of 2014 were \$548,733 leaving a surplus of \$13,611. Overall expenses are at 55.25% of budget, while income is at 56.62% of budget. As you can see, income is slightly above budget while expenses are approximately 3% below budget. Session ministry chairs are doing a great job of managing expenses, and thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.

Combat Hunger through the Crop Walk on Sunday, October 5

The Crop Hunger Walk is an interfaith event that engages people to walk together as they take a stand against hunger. Supporters are of different ages, faiths and backgrounds — together we raise awareness and funds for international relief/development, as well as local hunger-fighting. Some 2,000 communities across the country take part each year, and churches in our community have proudly been a part of that compassionate spirit!



This year's Crop Hunger Walk is set for Sunday, October 5, starting at the Fort Hill Presbyterian Church in downtown Clemson. Registration begins at 2:00 pm and the Crop Walk kicks off at 2:30 pm. Walkers can choose the 3.8-mile walk around the Clemson University campus, or a shorter, 1-mile option through Abernathy Park. Twenty-five percent of funds raised will go to Clemson Community Care (www.clemsoncommunitycare.org), our local food bank. The funds designated for international hunger relief go to Church World Service (www.churchworldservice.org), a well-established non-profit group working in over 80 countries to reduce hunger, develop sustainable and safe drinking water, support infant health and nutrition, and promote educational opportunities for women and girls. And Walk donors may designate their gifts to other approved international hunger fighting agencies if they choose.

Last year area churches created Crop Walk teams which raised \$13,000. Check with your church's Team Captain for details about this year's event. If you cannot participate in the Crop Walk on October 5, you can still help by contributing financially to support those from your church who will walk. Pledge materials are available from your Church's Team Captain, or by going online to www.crophungerwalk.org/clemsonsc.
