#### Choir Corner

Easter was such a glorious Sunday — the church filled with lilies, exciting music, prayers, proclamation, communion, people, and the presence of God. I don't know about you, but music can be moving and emotional. In every congregation I have served in my 47 years as a church musician, I am extremely moved when voices sing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today". I have tears filling my eyes at the joyful message and the punctuated Alleluia! I am humbled knowing that I am a child of God who is loved and will live with our Lord ever after. That is powerful and moving. I am thankful.

I was walking with a fellow friend in ministry after Easter, and she said she was disappointed that the church she worshipped in on Easter morning did not sing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today". She asked, "Is it no longer in the new hymnal?" I assured her it was, and I proceeded to tell her that there is also "Christ the Lord is Risen Today", and that must have been the one they did. I sang a few bars, and she told me that was it. Although the message was the same, she wished for the familiar.

We get accustomed to our comfort zones, don't we? We want to hear the same scripture, the same songs, the same everything that feels good. But I do find it refreshing when there is something new and challenging for me to tackle. It's like a new choir anthem that we usually begin rehearsing about 6 weeks ahead (not always, but hopefully that is the plan). We begin to put the pieces of the puzzle together learning notes, rhythms, words, dynamics, phrasing, tempos, etc. We put the foundation down, and add bricks, mortar, décor, until it is a finished product. That is exciting and a wonderful feeling of accomplishment.

I'm looking at our *Bridging Generations* experience in that way. It's our time to take all that is comfortable to us and build upon it making it new and ready to carry forth in the years to come. The prayer written for this experience is simple and poignant and says it all in two sentences that remind us to be aware of opportunities — *God, our Father, we pray you will open our hearts to new opportunities to grow in our love for you. Empowering us to give joyously as we look to the future of our beloved Fort Hill and community, bridging generations. In Your name we pray, Amen.* 

May we listen, watch, and pray that we be and do all we can, in and for your kingdom. Like the words Jesus taught us to pray — for Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen!

### University Ministry Update

**Spring Mission Trip Reflection**

This spring break, Clemson PSA made the trek to New Orleans, LA, to work with several mission projects. Our host church, Lakeview Presbyterian, provided us with home cooked Cajun style meals almost every night from gumbo to crawfish mac and cheese.

While in NOLA we worked with Wetlands Theological Education Project, painting a newly built church on the Grand Bayou with the Atakapa tribe. We also worked on the Johnson Pigeontown Community Garden building new beds for healthy and organic fruits and vegetables at no cost to the members of the community. We had the chance to work with the Church of Christ painting and doing yard work for their afterschool program. One of the best parts was being able to see the kids using the space! Our final day of mission was working with Habitat for Humanity. Some of us built pallets for air conditioning units, while others worked on a foundation for a new house. We were all tired by the end of the week.

In our downtime, we ventured in the French Quarter, eating at local joints like Café Du Monde, Juan's Flying Burrito, Morning Call, Acme Oyster House, and Huck Finn's Cafe! We also made our way over to the 9th Ward Museum to learn more about the devastating affects of Katrina.

We were able to spend time with several different cultures in the New Orleans community and learning their stories. We also got to learn about each other and bonded in a way that words fail to describe. The three major things I took away from this trip are (1) always speak the truth in all that you do, (2) you can never know the whole story, but that should never stop you from trying, and (3) there is never such a thing as too many beignets.


