Message From the Pastor

Making Room

We focused on making our facilities more inviting, accessible, and functional. One reason we are doing this is to make room for everyone of all abilities and ages. Making room is really just practicing the biblical art of hospitality, a critical Christian practice. Jesus made room. He broke bread with strangers, sinners, and religious officials who were misguided about the kingdom of God.

This summer while we are less driven by programs and busy schedules, I challenge you to break bread, to eat with someone you do not know well. I hope you will reach out to someone and invite them to go have brunch or lunch after worship. When Jesus was on the road to Emmaus the two strangers invited him to stay for dinner. It was in the breaking of the bread, that their eyes were opened, and they recognized Jesus. One of the ways we experience Jesus is when we gather in his name and listen to one another.

A couple of weeks ago, I invited two 20-somethings to go have appetizers after work. I wanted to hear how they are doing. I remember being a young adult, out of college, working, trying to figure out my relationships, my vocation, my life. It was a lonely time in some ways even though I was surrounded by people close to my age. I was the intern for University Ministry right here at Fort Hill. I needed people to talk with, wonder with, help me on my faith journey. I needed people who made room for me to feel at home or to ask questions or to give me the courage to try new things.

I actually think we all have those needs at all ages.

We are just sitting there talking, and these two found they had a similar need and interest for community and friendships, for exploring faith, and for mentoring. So they decided to do something about it. Working with our Christian Education ministry, they are starting a group for young adults meeting in the home of Nancy and Hugh Spitler, people who are happy to make room for others. They will meet Thursday nights.

Choir Corner

Most of you know I love to walk. I do it for exercise, for an escape from the world, to think, to ponder, to praise, to lament, see things around me, but honestly, most of my walks involve praying. Sometimes spoken, sometimes listening, sometimes in tears, and sometimes smiling. I was struggling about what to write for this July article. So I went for an evening walk at 8pm in 90 degree heat!! And I thought about prayer and how it helps me. How much I need it. And then I decided to come up with my own acronym for prayer. The best way I found to do it was to put the first word that popped into my head with each letter. So here it is:

Please Reason Answer Yes! Exercise Receive

It actually worked for me. Many prayers use the "please" when making a request of God. Prayers usually have a specific "reason" or purpose. Prayers expect an "answer". Hopefully, there is a "YES!" It is a daily "exercise" for me — not forced, but needed for my spiritual life. And most of all, I always "receive" something, whether it is God's presence, guidance, strength, or comfort.

I looked in our *Glory to God* hymnal under prayer, and there were 38 suggested hymns. Of course, there are hundreds of others that come under other categories like grief, healing, hope, praise, etc. I really don't think you can put prayer in just one "box". It is active, quiet, loud, celebratory, painful, restoring — the list goes on and on.

I encourage you to take some time to look through the hymnal. Out of hundreds of possibilities are three of my favorites (we always have 3 points, right?)

#834 Precious Lord, Take My Hand

Precious Lord, take my hand, lead me on, help me stand. I am tired, I am weak, I am worn...

#625 How Great Thou Art

O Lord, my God, when I in awesome wonder consider all the world thy hands have made...Then sings my soul...How Great Thou Art!

#794 O Savior, In This Quiet Place

O Savior, in this quiet place, where anyone may kneel, I also come to ask for grace, believing you can heal.

Think of your three or more hymns that are prayers for you or look through the hymnal and who knows? You may find the answer to one of your prayers or the simple assurance that "Yes, Jesus Loves Me".

Dare to Dream: Built on a Firm Foundation

The culmination of work over the past two years has led us to the point of having a detailed project plan and schedule for the renovation of our entire campus. The congregation has successfully supported the renovation project through pledges in the capital campaign. The session and congregation has approved moving forward with the renovation construction efforts.

Construction work has begun in several parts of the Fort Hill campus. The asbestos abatement work has been completed within the Education Building and demolition work is underway in the Education Building to prepare for the renovations. Work is in progress within the Courtyard and Bethlehem Hall. An obvious sign of the work is the removal of the covered walkway between the Admin and Education Buildings.

The key renovation schedule dates are listed below for awareness and are subject to change. No changes have occurred in the project schedule since these dates were provided in the May Window update.

Construction activities began on May 26 for the renovation. The key renovation schedule dates are listed below for awareness and are subject to change.

The Sanctuary work will be sequenced to minimize the number of Sundays that the Sanctuary will be unavailable. The current project plan has only three Sundays impacted with the other weeks having Sanctuary work areas cleaned up prior to Sunday for the Sanctuary to be used for services.

Thank you for all of the support that has been provided during this process. Also, thanks for your patience as we work through the renovation activities.

From the Finance Ministry

Through May, total income was \$388,539 while expenses for the first five months were \$334,081 leaving a surplus of \$54,458. Overall expenses are at 36% of budget, while income is at 42.4% of budget. As you can see, income is slightly above budget while expenses are 5.6% below budget. Session ministry chairs are doing a great job of managing expenses, and thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.

Bridging Generations Update: Pledged giving for month was \$68,825. Nonpledged building fund giving was \$1,545 and undesignated memorial gifts was \$1,238 for a total of \$71,600.

Students are exposed to new experiences such as Rock Climbing, Clemson athletic events, picnics, science experiments and trips to museums...all experiences that would otherwise be beyond the reach of these children.
