Important Steps in Ministry to Celebrate!

Four Fort Hill people are making transitions in ministry that we can celebrate. At the August 14 meeting of Foothills Presbytery, **Dana Waters** preached and was examined before the Presbytery. He passed with flying colors! His service for Ordination and Installation as a Minister of Word and Sacrament will be on **Sunday, September 25 at 10:45 AM**. We will have ONE service only to be a unified church family. It will be extra special to hear Dana's grandfather, a retired Presbyterian minister, preach his ordination.

Art Williams has been in the process of preparation as a "Commissioned Ruling Elder," a role that can include preaching and caring for congregations. Again, Art was warmly received by the Presbytery and was commissioned to serve the Richland Church in Oconee County. Art will preach and lead the flock there some Sundays, but remains an active member of Fort Hill where he has faithfully helped lead our Bridging Generations Campaign and Building Project. Art has been called to Ruling Elder ministry and served in a variety of ways. We are excited to be a part of this phase of his ministry.

Colin Pettigrew came before the Session to be approved to become a Candidate for Ministry as an ordained Teaching Elder. We loved hearing how Colin has been nurtured in the congregation, equipped over many years, and now entering his third year of Seminary is preparing for full-time ordained ministry. Colin gave Fort Hill credit for being that great foundation to launch him into new and broader ways of serving Christ in the world. Colin sees himself possibly seeking a call in youth or college ministry in the future. **Jake Crowther** visited with us this August as well. After graduating Clemson, studying Public Health and Spanish, and serving on the Associate Pastor Nominating Committee for the University Pastor, Jake felt called to serve Christ and His people in a new context. He shared how God has challenged and helped him grow while serving of the US/Mexico border in a very complicated place, yet seeing Christ in his neighbors and relationships. Jake will enter into a second year of service, this year in Austin, Texas working with prison systems and those living in them.

Art, Colin, and Jake are Ruling Elders who continue to live into that calling on their lives keeping the vows they made. All disciples of Jesus Christ have a ministry, and these are some wonderful ways these men have lived out God's call.

From the Finance Ministry

From the Finance Ministry – Through July, total income was \$525,544 while expenses for the first seven months were \$515,523 for a surplus of \$10,021. Overall expenses are at 54.7% of budgeted, while income is at 55.8%. As you can see, income is approximately 3% below budget while expenses are 3.7% below budget. Session ministry chairs are doing a great job of managing expenses, and thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community and around the world.

Bridging Generations Update: Pledge giving for month was \$18,817. Non-pledge giving was \$875 and interest income of \$4.05 for a total of \$19,696. Renovation loan principle as of 7/31/16 \$1,611,054.16.
