Message From the Pastor

Faith Is Feet Moving

When my children began to walk, I would hold both their hands, stand behind them, and basically keep them from falling. Gradually, I would walk beside them and begin to let go, only holding one finger eventually. They were actually walking. They just needed to touch a finger to feel safe. Then we gradually got to the point where I would be out in front of them with my arms out, just out of grasp. They would toddle forward toward me without holding anything, just knowing they were heading in my direction, trusting that I loved and believed in them. I would even back up further and further encouraging them that they could keep going. They would squeal with glee as they realized they were walking all alone. As I was reading our devotional for Lent, I read this quote by Frederick Beuchner, "Faith is the word that describes the direction our feet start moving when we find that we are loved. Faith is stepping out into the unknown with nothing to guide us but a hand just beyond our grasp."

God is like a loving mother or father who is just beyond our grasp encouraging us to keep stepping in the right direction. Faith is taking steps into the unknown, into mystery, trusting a Presence to be there cheering us on.

This Lent we have been walking toward a cross with Christ just ahead of us.

Trusting in the "accomplished fact" of Christ's resurrection, however, we listen for the word of God in the time-honored stories of the church's Lenten journey. We follow Jesus into the wilderness, resist temptation, fast, and proceed "on the way" to Jerusalem, and the cross. Our Lenten journey is one of metanoia ("turning around"), of changing directions from self-serving toward the self-giving way of the cross.¹

Continue that journey toward the cross in Worship. Palm Sunday begins Holy Week on April 9. We gather for Evening Prayers that Wednesday at 6:30. On Maundy Thursday the Last Supper will be celebrated after we commune around the tables for a dinner (Thursday, April 13, Dinner at 6:15 pm, Worship 7:00 pm/Tartan Hall). Following the darkness of Friday and Saturday with the Crucifixion and death of Jesus, we will gather at Old Stone Church outdoor amphitheater at 7:00 am for a Sunrise service. Easter Sunday, April 16, we celebrate with music and meaning the joy of the resurrection life through Christ. Both morning services will be held in the Sanctuary with the leadership of the Choir. This also helps with parking and makes room for guests who will worship with us.

I hope you find yourself stepping out in new ways this year as you journey together with us in faith.

Let's get on our Way toward the Cross...



From the Finance Ministry

Through the first two months of 2017, total income was \$168,462 while expenses were \$136,532 leaving a surplus of \$31,930. Income includes a one-time transfer of \$24,629 from restricted accounts which significantly contributes to this surplus. Overall expenses are at 14.6% of budget, while income is at 18.6% of budget. Spending in January and February is normally below budget as ministry chairs are working to implement their plans for 2017. Your financial support enables Fort Hill to continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.

Bridging Generations Update: Pledged giving for the month was \$33,423. Non-pledged giving was \$448, undesignated memorial gifts were \$405, and interest income of \$1.20 for a total of \$34,278. Total income year-to-date: \$99,047. Total expenses year-to-date: \$9,562. Loan Principal balance: \$1,301,589.41.

Ultimately I realize what I was looking for at Family Promise was a way to find me, a successful, satisfied and happy me. I was looking for that person who could look in the mirror and feel good about what I had done at the end of the day.

I know now that this will only come when I have listened to the voices of the homeless, understood their needs, helped them to identify more resources, find more solutions and supported them to achieve their own goals. I now realize that by finding them, I have found my success. I have found me.
