Message From the Pastor Christian Unity

Disunity seems to be running rampant in our world. Scriptures speak to Christian unity many times in the New Testament. What is interesting to note is that most of Paul's letters speak to this as a part of his addressing conflict in these faith communities. Almost immediately after Pentecost when the Spirit descended upon and filled the diverse group of people, conflict arose. That moment when they all understood one another did not last forever. God was doing a new thing. Things were changing. Change always is accompanied by conflict.

After reading Isaiah 53:7-8 and having Philip tell him the good news of Jesus, the Ethiopian Eunuch, a sexual minority, wanted to be baptized along the roadside. Philip had to discern the Spirit and went with him into the water (Acts 8:26-40). Eunuchs were not included in the faith community before, but God was doing a new thing. There was the argument over eating clean and unclean animals, then Peter had a vision that helped redefine who is included in God's covenant (Acts 10). Now Gentiles were included. God was doing a new thing. The Corinthians were enjoying their new found freedom in Christ and taking it too far. The Galatians argued over whether one had to become a Jew first before becoming a follower of Jesus. You get the picture.

Paul writes responses like this, "for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Galatians 3:27-28. The church of the Pentecost would include, not exclude, all who come to Christ by faith through grace.

I weep for churches in conflict even as I pray for our United Methodist brothers and sisters. I have wept over the conflicts I have experienced in my own church, the PC (USA). Since I was a child I have seen the church fragment and argue. My family's church, Beersheba Presbyterian (est. 1775) split in the late 1970s over joining with the United Presbyterian Church which included African Americans and ordained women as officers. I learned at an early age the pain of conflict and broken relationships in church. I have served the church for 24 years and conflicts continue to arise. So I have made a commitment to work for Christian Unity. It is our calling in Scripture. A fractured church weakens the witness to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. That is more important than our preferences and what suits me. Seeking God's will first under the Lordship of Jesus Christ is the goal.

Living in community is hard work though. So I aspire to live this motto attribute to St. Augustine of Hippo, "In essentials, unity; in nonessentials, freedom; in all things love."

Love is the bottom line. I invite you to consider this motto as one of your own.



From the Finance Ministry

Through May, total income was \$402,029 while expenses for the first five months were \$385,131 leaving a surplus of \$16,898. Overall expenses are at 41% of budget, while income is virtually on budget despite a significant deficit for the month of May. Summer is typically low income, so please continue your pledges and offerings during these summer months.

Bridging Generations Update: Pledged giving for the month was \$13,596.44. Non-pledged giving was \$675, undesignated memorial gifts were \$175 and interest income of \$1.75 for a total of \$14,441.01. Total income year to date: \$208,518.45. Total expenses year to date: \$184,058.79. Loan principle: \$1,148,264.41.
