Message From the Pastor

"The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood."

John 1:14 (The Message)

The Word (Jesus) moved into the neighborhood. Jesus reveals God to us all! We are still celebrating Christmas until January 6 which is Epiphany. And as we turn to a new year, I wonder if you have thought about where God in Jesus the Christ is at work around you, where you live. What if we each took a moment at the end of each day to reflect on where we saw the hand of God at work around us. I think about when Chuck and I were dating. I lived in Clemson and Chuck traveled with his work based out of Greensboro, NC. We talked each night on the phone sharing our day, counseling each other, listening. That is sort of like prayer. Maybe we could have an evening conversation with God the same way.

On the other hand, what if we start each day with a prayer of keeping our eyes open to how we might share the love of God in Jesus, the Christ? I think that would change how we respond to email, to the upset person on the other end, or how we share kindness with the store clerk who seems to be having a bad day. And if we start our day like that, we can also ask, "Where is God calling me to go in my neighborhood today to share the love of Christ?" While our day's agenda may be planned, we can be open to where God may be calling us.

In the Greek Orthodox tradition, they call Mary the "God-bearer." She is the one who brings (literally births) God's love into the world. Each of us can be God-bearers to those we encounter or seek out. That is how God becomes flesh and blood and lives in our neighborhoods, through you and me, through us. We are united in Christ and called to bear the Word into the world. Howard Thurman, writes:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

Followers of Christ, the Word made flesh and blood, may it be so through us! Grace and Peace,



Small groups of Christians have met since the early days of the faith. In Acts 2: 42 we hear "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." This kind of personal connection among Christians is a central component in healthy congregations. Bible scholar N. T. Wright says it is the third purpose for the church to exist.

"The church exists primarily for two closely correlated purposes: to worship God and to work for his kingdom in the world ... The church also exists for a third purpose, which serves the other two: to encourage one another, to build one another up in faith, to pray with and for one another, to learn from one another and teach one another, and to set one another examples to follow, challenges to take up, and urgent tasks to perform. This is all part of what is known loosely as fellowship."

— N.T. Wright, Simply Christian: Why Christianity Makes Sense

No matter one's age, Christians need the company of one another on a regular basis even beyond worship to sustain a life of faith in the ordinariness of daily living. To gather around table to feast together, to share one another's burdens, to serve together in acts of kindness toward others, to play together and enjoy one another's company are important ways adults grow in faith. We need one another just as Donald Miller notes.

"I think it is interesting that God designed people to need other people. We see those cigarette advertisements with the rugged cowboy riding around alone on a horse, and we think that is strength, when really, it is like setting your soul down on a couch and not exercising it. The soul needs to interact with other people to be healthy."


- To start the process of finding common interests, we propose the 2019 Adult Ministry Small Group Survey list of "common interest" possibilities.
