I want to thank you, Fort Hill Church, for being God's presence, comfort, and strength for our family this December. My brother Andy died by suicide on December 8, something none of us ever imagined could happen. He was driven, brilliant, and a helper and friend to anyone in need. He also struggled with depression over the years. But his circumstances changed, and he decided he did not want to be a burden, he wrote in a note to his boys. He was used to being the one to take care of everything, not of receiving help.

We say, "It is more blessed to give than receive." Sometimes we take this too far and do not allow ourselves to receive, too. Even Jesus allowed Thomas to touch his wounds, to come close and see for himself that Jesus was the same one crucified and now risen. To touch the wounds of those hurting is a holy thing. God enters in and ministers in and through the pain, and we know we are not alone. We are companions in Christ, who are not afraid to walk in the darkness trusting that Christ is the light of the world that overcomes darkness. We can be wounded healers to one another.

Many of you have shared how suicide has impacted your life. For that struggle, loss, and grief, I am so very sorry. I think the most disturbing thing for my community back home was the realization, "If it can happen to Andy, the strongest person I know, it can happen to anyone." In fact, the CDC reports that suicide is on the rise in almost every state. And it is a leading cause of death in young adults. South Carolina had an increase of 38-58% from 1999-2016. What a wake-up call!

Chuck and I are in discernment about what we are called to do as both Andy and our nephew Hunt died by suicide 16 months apart. Both died using a firearm which has a very low survival rate. *Alliance of Hope; Support for Survivors* has been a help to us (https://allianceofhope.org/). Please pray with us for all those who suffer the effects of suicide and those struggling to keep at it one more day, one more hour. It is a complex issue, but our faith teaches us that we can be Christ-like for one another in our darkest moments. Thank you for your comforting words, showing up, sending notes, and praying for us. Thank you for being the priesthood of all believers.

As we enter the start of Confirmation Season for current 8th graders, I was asked by the confirmation leadership team to look back on my time as a confirmand in Spring 2017.

What immediately came to mind was my amazing confirmation partner, Mrs. Diane Egan. Before confirmation, I had known Mrs. Egan as a choir member and a loyal Girl Scout Cookie customer, but not much more. However, through confirmation we built a much stronger relationship as she helped me grow as a Christian and form a better understanding of my beliefs. She faithfully showed up to every meeting, worked with me to write my faith statement, was always willing (and still is) to answer any questions and went above and beyond to form an even stronger connection with me by coming to my dance, band, and piano recitals.

Upon further reflection, I realized just how much of what I learned during the 5-month period of Confirmation, I still put into practice today. Of course, I gained a deeper understanding of key aspects of Presbyterian worship such as the Lord's Prayer, the Doxology, etc. However, what I learned through confirmation went much deeper than just that. I gained a better appreciation of what it means to live like a Christian and spread God's love every day. A Brief History of the World

Well, at least the world of Fort Hill Medical Mission — a message of gratitude from Bob and Susan Brown

This is a story of how an idea in 1997 became an immediate reality because of Fort Hill Presbyterian Church. As Susan and I think back on the success of the Fort Hill Medical Mission, we are continually amazed, knowing the strong shoulders on which we stood and feeling again the warm love and dedication of the congregation.

In 1976 I spent three months in Nigeria, leaving Susan, Rob, and Wendy in a cold Rochester, Minnesota, and during that time the mission bug bit me quite hard. It stayed with me until Susan and I finally decided in 1997 that the time had come to make a change from our Clemson Ophthalmology practice to an overseas mission one. We talked with Fort Hill's pastor at that time, Jim Richardson, and he grabbed the baton and took off with it. The rest of the story speaks of the loving collective heart of Fort Hill through the years, its caring congregation, and its strong leadership which for sure continued with Laura Conrad and Mary Morrison.

From late 1997 to the final mission trip in March 2017, Fort Hill commissioned and sent 44 teams "over the third hill" around the world (meaning remote locations). You, with the Lord's help, brought sight to many poor and disadvantaged people in China, Vietnam, Cambodia, Haiti, Nicaragua, Guatemala, Ghana, Tanzania, Rwanda, Burundi, Nigeria, Zambia, and India. When I talk with the pre-med students at Clemson, I give them the option of having discussions about medicine in the US or about medicine on missions. It is amazing that they choose missions 75% of the time. Here is a part of my introduction for them:

To be poor is one thing — but to be blind and poor is an ultimate handicap. In a multitude of ways it drains both that person and their family. Removing the blindness frees that person and the entire family, bringing joy, gratitude, independence, self-esteem, longer life expectancy, and better economics. No wonder there is dancing on that day along with singing and tears. We have been blessed to be a part of thousands of individuals' and families' lives in this way.

They want to know how we could pull this off, how our "little ole Fort Hill Church," enabled such extensive success. They often think at first that we must have joined a big medical group such as Doctors Without Borders. No — our church right here in Clemson sent us to remote locations on our own choosing. I tell them that we have received requests to come and help, like messages on parachutes coming down from Heaven. We never had to "advertise" our availability. The needs came to us, and we responded with wings lifted up by God and Fort Hill.

On the 44 trips we saw thousands of patients and did thousands of operations. Fort Hill donors provided thousands of dollars over the 19 years, and good American companies donated amazing quantities of supplies for each trip. Sometimes those supplies even included antibiotics and general medications for the hospitals we were visiting. Those companies were willing to donate BECAUSE Fort Hill was willing to donate. You see, there had to be an engine at the front of the train. Year after year, Fort Hill pulled hard and with remarkable strength, purpose, and generosity.

Finally, in 2017, Susan and I laid the knives down and retired — for the second time. On our "epitaph" can go the dates November 1997 — March 2017. Do we miss those trips now, our teams, and Fort Hill's energy and excitement for them? Yes — we do. Yes, indeed, we do. Sometimes we feel like fish out of water. Retirement really is a 2-sided coin. But we have the best memories in the world and this message is an effort to send a huge THANK YOU to Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, using pitiful words that cannot do the feelings in our hearts justice.

Here, as I end this love letter to Fort Hill, Susan and I want to express our gratitude to each person who plopped down on an airplane seat and flew across some big body or bodies of water with us — heading east, west, or south. We could never have accomplished the work load without them, and so much joy came from simply being with them. They gave us, the patients, and their families their genuine warmth and love through hugs, smiles, many ways of comforting, and sometimes even singing to ease a patient's nervous tension during surgery. We love those brave souls and we love all who were back here lifting us up to the Lord. Honestly, what can I say — but that we accomplished all that was done because you were the Lord's hands, the strong engine at the front of the train.

Thankfulness beyond words, including the way the non-medical missions have blossomed with Beth Chapman's special love for El Faro. Blessings from the Lord just keep on coming our way.


From the Finance Ministry

Through November, total income was \$892,493 while expenses were \$839,336 providing a surplus of \$53,157. Overall expenses are at 87% of budget while income is at 92.6% of budget. While Session ministry chairs are doing a great job of managing expenses, the surplus is due in part to the loss of our Pastor for Youth and Mission and your generous contributions for the month of November.

Bridging Generations Update:

Building Fund pledge giving for the month was \$8,570. Building fund non-pledge giving was \$205, undesignated memorial gifts were \$20,000, and building fund interest income of \$0.06 combined with Building Fund pledge giving reflect a total of \$28,775.06 building fund giving for the month.

Total Building Fund Income YTD: \$185,251.79 Building Fund Loan Principal Balance: \$347,501.90
