# **Message From the Pastor**

## **Basic Training for the Soul**

My brother Les went into the Air Force when I was three. I remember talk of Basic Training before he was sent to Texas for the next four years. It is a mystery to me what happened in that training, but I knew it was intense. He lost weight and his pretty wavy hair (it was the 1970's). He was a skinny 6'6" rail by the end.

The church is in basic training, too. During Lent, we are focusing on being self-reflective, seeking a change of heart or action as followers of Jesus. We walk this journey together demanding the best of ourselves, ready to support one another, and see new truths that help us group in self-understanding. We began the journey of repentance and journey toward a cross on February 26 with Ash Wednesday. We are dust, but God makes beautiful things out of dust. We will celebrate the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. This journey of Lent represents our dying to self, so we might be raised with Christ.

Trusting in the "accomplished fact" of Christ's resurrection, however, we listen for the word of God in the time-honored stories of the church's Lenten journey. We follow Jesus into the wilderness, resist temptation, fast, and proceed "on the way" to Jerusalem, and the cross. Our Lenten journey is one of metanoia ("turning around"), of changing directions from self-serving toward the self-giving way of the cross. <sup>i</sup>

We are in training as disciples of Jesus Christ. We work out and exercise our faith so that discipleship becomes muscle memory. We act in faithful response to the good news of God's love, shown most clearly in the cross and resurrection of Jesus. Please join on Wednesdays at 5:15 for *Feasting on the Word/*Conference Room, a small group reflecting on the Scripture for Sunday with the Preacher. I hope to see you in worship each Sunday as we go through Basic Training for the Soul, and at Maundy Thursday for Footwashing/Handwashing and the Last Supper (April 9 at 7:30 pm).

# 2020 Confirmation Season: Impactful!

On Friday evening, February 7, eight Confirmands and five adult chaperones traveled to Charlotte to participate in "Urban Plunge" through CROSS Missions. This was an opportunity to come together as a group in worship, fellowship, and service to others. We were housed at the Outreach Center of Myers Park Presbyterian Church with two other youth groups. On Saturday we visited Samaritan's House where members of the homeless community are able to receive care following a hospital stay, injury, or illness. Our Confirmands played board games and visited with the residents while enjoying cinnamon rolls freshly baked in the kitchen. In the afternoon, we met with a representative from Lily Pad Haven which is an organization committed to providing counseling, housing, and case management services to victims of human trafficking. As a group we were able to participate in the Red Sand Project to raise awareness of this pervasive issue. Red sand was sprinkled in the cracks of the sidewalk in downtown Charlotte and when asked by those passing by what they were doing the Confirmands did an excellent job explaining their mission to raise awareness and advocate for victims of human



trafficking. Before traveling back to Clemson, we attended Sunday morning services at Myers Park Presbyterian Church. We look forward to continuing our study of the book of Mar, learning about our creeds and confessions, why we respond to God's love through mission, what Presbyterians believe, and making a Sunday afternoon visit to Clemson Downs.

During this season of lent, please prayerfully consider donating blood. Christ shed his blood to give us eternal life and you can save three lives with one unit of blood.

### Did You Know...

From time to time in this year 2020 you will read in the bulletins and monthly *The Window* small bits of history mostly taken from the book *Country Church and College Town: A History of Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, 1895-1995* published in celebration of our 100th anniversary. The main part was written by a graduate student in history here at Clemson, Sean Howard McMahon, and it was brought up to 1995 by our own Drs. Reel and McKale.

DID YOU KNOW...that the name Fort Hill came from Senator and Vice President John C. Calhoun's plantation which forms the core of land-grant Clemson University. Mr. Calhoun named his plantation in honor of Fort Rutledge built in 1776 by General Andrew Pickens, a great patriot in the Revolutionary War, who is buried in the cemetery of Old Stone Church on Hwy. 76 south of Clemson. General Pickens was also known as the "Fighting Elder" because of his strong Presbyterian faith.


