## Message From the Pastor

### Letter from Pastor Laura and the Session about Fort Hill's Return to Church Plan

Christians are familiar with waiting time. Advent and Lent are seasons where we actively wait for the good news of the incarnation "God with Us" and the saving death and resurrection of Jesus. We seem to be stuck in that kind of waiting time. Your Session along with those who serve on a COVID-19 Task Group have been working on a way forward. As someone wrote, "Closing the church building was easy. Re-opening is the harder part." We have a "Return to Church" plan that includes phases based on the data we are monitoring (Summary follows). To date, we have not reached phase one, and continue meeting online and at a safe distance.

So many of us are missing the gifts of faith community — life shared in person, praising God, and seeking God's direction and guidance among other Christians; so we grieve, even as we adapt to this situation. Our call has always been to love our neighbors, particularly those most vulnerable. We have learned this virus is very contagious, especially when we gather closely to pray aloud, sing, and share in the fellowship. And while the online tools are a gift, some of us are weary of electronics, hungering for real fellowship. Until our criteria are met, we must wait a little longer. Christians are waiting people. Ultimately, we wait until God's Kingdom comes fully and Christ returns. In the meantime, we give thanks for the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, gentleness, self-control, generosity, patience, kindness, and faithfulness, that carry us through. We ARE the Church, together; however, our meeting place is temporarily closed.

We have developed a phased plan to return based on gating criteria rather than a specific date. We hope to enter these phases this summer. We continue to adapt to new information so please be patient with us and pray for our leaders. At any point if the virus levels spike, we may even have to pull back. Currently, we are not yet to phase one according to federal guidelines, CDC, and SC DHEC data. Here are some common conditions to phases one and two.

1. High Risk individuals (persons over 65 and those with underlying health conditions) are encouraged to stay away from gathering at the building. Youth and Children need special consideration. These are some of our most precious and valued brothers and sisters. Keep joining together online for Zoom classes or YouTube worship and devotionals. Let the pastors or your deacon know if you wish a phone call to share joys or concerns. We love you and want to keep you safe!

2. Face Coverings are required for these first phases. Social-Distancing is necessary even though we are a hugging, handshaking bunch. Instead of thinking of only my freedom, we model love for one another. As Paul writes prior to the fruits of the Spirit, "the only thing that counts is faith working through love." (Galatians 5:6b). In our common spaces we wear face masks. An exception — worship speakers when return to in-person worship.
3. Worship — during phase one we will offer online worship. When we cross the phase two threshold, we will provide both online and limited seating worship in the Sanctuary. In the meantime, I appreciate the efforts of folks of all ages contributing to our worship weekly on Fort Hill's YouTube channel (click [Fort Hill YouTube](#)). You can go there for daily devotionals as well. Missing sports on TV? There are hours of worship services here ☺.
4. Cleaning and Sanitation are essential — those who use the building will help with cleaning. We ask for your cooperation when we have those protocols in place.

In the meantime, we can be in ministry in new ways. Fellowship is offering a Sam Burchfield Concert on June 21 on YouTube. The same day this year's Confirmation Class will assist in worship and teach us all! Judy, Margaret, and I are cooking up a little online concert "Hymns of the Faith." The children and youth will have a socially-distanced, outdoor goody bag pickup. And Vacation Bible School will be online. I might be dusting off my Energizer dance moves for that. Remember ...

*5:1 Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2 through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, 5 and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.*

Catholic, he has been going to Fort Hill for as long as he can remember and is grateful for his Fort Hill family.







**Through April**, total income was \$352,094 while expenses for the first four months were \$292,867 leaving a surplus of \$60,057. Overall expenses are at 29% of budget, while income is at 35.3%. As you can see, income remains above budget while expenses are about 4% below budget. # Christian Action Ministry Update

## International Missionary Update:

### US–Mexico Border Ministry with Mark Adams and Miriam Escobar

Fort Hill Presbyterian Church has a longstanding legacy for supporting the work of international missionaries via Presbyterian Mission. Currently, through FHPC Christian Action Ministry, your financial contributions assist with sharing God's love in Congo, Haiti, and on the US-Mexican Border. I have communicated with Mark Adams and received an update on their ministry, which I'd like to share with the congregation.

FHPC began their official support of Mark Adams and Miriam Escobar's border ministry a decade ago in 2010. Mark is involved with church development, health, family counseling, and mission education in the Agua Prieta region of Mexico, near the border with Arizona. Over the past year, they have focused much of their energy on large numbers of families fleeing extreme violence and poverty. Mark said, *"We are grateful to God for the light that shines in unexpected places, the light that allows us to see and experience the hope in the midst of despair; peace in the midst of a conflicted border; joy in the midst of a community beset with sadness; and love in the midst of a world filled with fear and hatred."* Profound and meaningful thoughts on refugees and human migration.

Mark also shared his gratitude specifically for their partnership with FHPC. As you might expect, the current pandemic has affected their ministry and their ability to travel and requires them to shelter in place for the immediate future. *"In addition to not wanting to leave Mexico at this time,"* Mark said, *"we want to be 'present' with our partners in the midst of this crisis. While we know that we will be separated from them in this time of physical distancing with no gathered worship, or vigils, or events or meetings or meals, the message that we would give to our partners by removing ourselves from the community and separating ourselves geographically from them in a time of crisis is not something that we feel called to do. We believe in the importance of being a 'presence of peace' in the midst of crisis — whether that be cartel violence or of a pandemic violence. Pray that we can figure out what it means to be a presence of peace in this time."*

Even in a different country, like most of us, Mark and his family have been adjusting to quarantine life, working and schooling from home. He says they have been spending more time on the patio, reading, gardening, throwing a baseball, cooking together, and *"being more attentive to the incredible skies out here whether the spectacular sunrises and sunsets; or moon rises; or last month's Lyrid meteor shower when Nathan and I climbed up on the roof to watch — amazing that people have been watching this annual shower for at least 2700 years."*

Mark also asked that I pass along a link so interested FHPC members can participate in their [Coffee, Conversations and Compassion campaign](#) which began on May 1 and will continue through June. These Zoom conversations take place each Thursday at 7:00 pm (EDT) and all are invited to join and discuss the ministries and ministry partners of Frontera de Cristo.

I want to close with thoughts that Mark shared: *"Miriam and I are grateful to God to serve with Frontera de Cristo, a community of faith that seeks out places of darkness, trusting that God's light will be manifest and shine in and through us. We are grateful for your partnership in ministry that gives us the opportunity to accompany a community where the darkness sometimes can seem overwhelming, and yet the light of Christ shines."*
