What Unites Us?

⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the **common good.** (1 Corinthians 12:4-7)

Presbyterian-type Christians believe in pursuing the common good. In contrast the outrage, anger, snark, and constant complaints, that read like a social media thread or a comments section, God calls us to serve the common good. The Church is called to be salt and light, Jesus says. But there are days when the darkness overwhelms and our dinner is a bland concoction of contempt. So we go to the source of nourishment and bathe in the Light of Christ. And we learn that the one who calls us into communion with himself, also calls us into pursing community. We belong to the One and to one another. And a critical part of that is communication. Communion-community-communication are key in pursuing the common good. God loves a good 3-part plan.

In the marketplace of media and social media, the Reformers taught that even our tools and inventions are susceptible to sin. Tools can be used for good or evil. That us-them, mean spiritedness pervades our public spaces and dialogue. Jesus gave us a command to "Love God... and love our neighbor as we love ourselves" creating the framework by which we live in that common good. We filter, sort, and critically think with the mind of Christ first. But even better, we stay grounded in God's Word which defines us and how we are to treat neighbors and build up neighborhoods where God's children can thrive and flourish. Scripture is the lens through which we read the world while we follow the living Word, Jesus Christ. These are ways we stay grounded in the Good.

Each person made in the image of God has value, purpose and gifts...you guessed it, to serve the common good. As I write this article, I am thinking of the Class of 2020 of Presbyterian College whom I will address at Baccalaureate, Oct. 2. I pray for my children's generation that they might reclaim this part of our rich heritage. Not because it is part of history, but because I cannot imagine a better time than the present for God's Spirit to work powerfully among us.

Communion, community, communication for the common good requires a commitment.

God-Neighbors-Self, in that order. Are you in?

Family Promise

Family Promise is one of the local missions Fort Hill Presbyterian Church supports. Family Promise helps equip families experiencing homelessness with counseling, educational programs, life skill classes, and encouragement while they strive to find housing and independence. Throughout the year Fort Hill hosts Family Promise in our church building.

Unfortunately, COVID-19 has prevented local churches from providing shelter to our families in need. During this time, Family Promise has secured housing through a hotel in Easley and relied on gift cards to assist with family meals and gas. This has placed an increased financial burden on this local mission. In lieu of the time, effort, and hospitality our church volunteers have not been able to offer, our FHPC's Christian Action Ministry (CAM) has directed contingency funds to help with the additional financial needs Family Promise is experiencing. Family Promise continues to be in need of prepaid restaurant cards in low denominations to help support families in the program. The following restaurant gift cards are suggested:

From the Finance Ministry

From the Finance Ministry – Through August, total income was \$649,111 while expenses for the first 8 months were \$584,625 for a surplus of \$64,486. Overall

expenses are at 58.4% of budgeted, while income is at 64.9%. As you can see, income is approximately 1% below budget and expenses are roughly 8% below budget. General Fund sustained a loss of \$19,800 for the month, reducing the



year to date (YTD) surplus to \$64,500. Total expenses were \$21,500 under budget for the month and are \$82,000 under budget YTD. Youth Director / Minister vacancy has accounted for \$39,700 in expense savings. Football parking/fundraising generated \$20,200 in income, but with the limitations on game attendance, these funds will be tied to parking for the 2021 football season. This resulted in a reversing of the revenue of \$20,200.

Bridging Generations Update: Loan principle: \$296,058.79.

Return to Church Update

Fort Hill Return to Church Plan Summary

Updated September 22, 2020

Requirement: all FHPC gatherings require physical distancing of 6 feet and face coverings.

We are currently in Phase One. We use the gating criteria set forth by the Opening Up America Again plan. We will monitor and adjust this plan as new information occurs.

- <u>14-day downward trajectory of documented COVID-19 cases reported.</u> We will follow the number of positive cases in our local 4 counties and SC DHEC's 14 (and 28 day) day percent positive graphs.
- Hospitals able to treat all patients without crisis and PPE shortages.
- Readily available testing and contact tracing.
- Needed supplies, from hand sanitizer to toilet paper, are readily available.

Safe at Home

- Holding online worship services and devotionals only.
- Bible studies, small groups, etc. should be meeting online.
- Service ministries are using safety protocols and only addressing essential needs.
- Minimal, drop-in staffing enough for essential operations (deposits, mail processing, etc.)
- Family Graveside Services outdoors with social distancing and masks.
- Continue to contact staff by phone and email.

Currently in Phase One

Outdoor Gatherings:

- Outdoor, socially distanced gatherings where persons bring their own chair and equipment to prevent shared surfaces are permitted i.e. Wednesday Evening Prayer.
- Size of group is determined by the ability to be spaced out.
- Youth groups allowed to meet outdoors.

Indoor Gathering:

- Sunday Worship online
- Preferred that bible studies and small groups continue meeting online.
- Some essential staff may work in offices. Telework continues.
- Special worship occasions like weddings and funerals with limited number.
- Children and youth guidelines being developed.
- Vulnerable Individuals (persons over 65 and those with underlying health conditions) recommended to stay home.
- Disciple Care- visits in healthcare facilities, hospitals, and high-risk individuals based on the care facilities' guidance (pastors, deacons).
- If small groups determine that meeting in-person in the facilities is necessary, they will be required to follow the defined guidance on use of rooms according to number in group.

Examples: Tartan Hall- 15-20 persons and Sanctuary 20-40 persons

Meeting rooms: to reserve contact Julie Bryant, <u>julie.bryant@forthillchurch.org</u>. She will direct groups to the appropriate-sized room. Groups are required to follow cleaning and reporting protocols.

Phase Two (Sanctuary at 50% capacity)

- Worship, single Sunday service, with 50% capacity following protocols in place and online offered for those unable to attend.
- Vulnerable Individuals (people over 65 and those with underlying health conditions), whether staff, volunteers, or program participants, recommended to stay home. Children and youth guidelines being developed.
- Special worship occasions like weddings and funerals limited to 50% capacity.
- Meeting in person as small groups in the facilities requires that the room size fits the number in group.
- Office function returns with attention to cleaning.

Return to Church Update, cont.

Reporting Protocol

- 1. Any persons who become ill or test positives notifies the group leader of the church where they were present. Please be prepared to share the date symptoms began, date of test and results. (Group leader, whether meeting on campus or off, needs to know this notification process and cleaning procedure.)
- 2. Group leader requests permission of the person/family to share by name or if they prefer to remain anonymous.
- 3. Group leader will email or call Lori Houck, Office Administrator, at 864-723-1669 or lori.houck@forthillchurch.org. She will notify Scott for cleaning spaces if needed and update the Task Group. Office Administrator will also record the report.
- 4. Group leader updates all persons present at the event and any related events who may have come into contact with the person. Utilize the Fort Hill check-in google form which collects that data.
- 5. Task Group reports and updates the Session.
