Message From the Pastor

Dear Disciples of the Fort Hill Community:

At its stated meeting Tuesday, the Session approved a motion from the Return to Church Task Group that we resume in-person worship in our sanctuary on Sunday, November 1. We will follow the parameters and protocol previously established. Sign-ups will be limited to 30 people per service in addition to ministerial staff and those assisting with the service. Our 10:45 am service in the sanctuary will be streaming online live. You may join us at that time or worship using the recording of that service afterwards on our YouTube Channel <u>Fort Hill Presbyterian Church</u>. We encourage those who are vulnerable to continue to join us online during Phase One.

The Session had a thoughtful discussion about this move to allow in person worship with strict guidelines since we are in Phase One of our plan which allows only small groups indoors. Just as there are a wide range of views about this topic in our congregation, so there are a variety of opinions on the Session. The vote to return on November 1, while not unanimous, was approved with a clear majority of Session members in favor. Our Return to Church Task group follows trends and data for our college town and surrounding area. We considered safe physical distance seating as well as the effects of gathering indoors for the length of time of the service. We realize that worship will not be the same as it was back in March but we are eager to open up the opportunity to our members who want to worship 'in-person' and agree to comply with safe gathering protocol utilizing the guidelines presented below:

- You may sign up for worship in the sanctuary starting this Monday, October 26. **Our signups conclude at Thursday, 12:00pm**. While our numbers are limited we ask that you consider signing up for every other Sunday to allow others to participate.
- Individuals experiencing the following symptoms should not attend worship: Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea, diarrhea or vomiting. Anyone who has a known exposure to Covid-19 within 14 days prior to worship should not attend worship. Anyone who has been diagnosed with Covid-19 should wait 14 days after diagnosis and be asymptomatic before attending worship.
- Worship attendees must wear a mask at all times while on the property of FHPC. Face shields will not be a substitute for masks.

- Be prepared to check in at the entrances with a smartphone with the help of a greeter as needed. Registration of your attendance will provide information in the event contact tracing is necessary.
- We will use two entrances to the Sanctuary, the front doors and the porte-cochere door. Doors will open at 10:25 am. No other parts of the building will be accessed.
- Hand-sanitizer and the Narthex bathrooms are available for use.
- After arrival, an usher will direct each family to available seating in accordance with safe and appropriate distancing.
- The worship service itself will be an adaptation of our traditional service, but with no congregational singing at this time. Music will be mostly instrumental.
- The pastoral staff leading the service will enter and exit the Chancel and will not greet worshipers following the service.
- An usher will direct worshipers to exit the sanctuary, one row at a time, when the service is over.
- There will be no nursery, childcare, or Wee Kirk at this time. A "Story for All Children" will be a part of the worship for children to experience via live streaming broadcasts.
- If anyone who attends worship in the sanctuary is diagnosed with Covid-19 within 14 days of attending the service, that individual is asked to notify Lori Houck, lori.houck@forthillchurch.org, or pastoral staff immediately. Those attending worship during that time will be notified of the exposure.

Please note that November 1 is the first Sunday when we "fall back" after Daylight Savings Time ends.

Our church leadership will continue to monitor the situation with the coronavirus, and the Return to Church Task Group continues to check in weekly. I am very grateful to our Return to Church Task Group and to the Session for the leadership that they continue to provide through these extraordinary times.

May God's grace, comfort, and strength surround each of you, our church, and our community.

Advent Bible Study Opportunity



bring light into the darkness. Now more than ever, we invite you to reflect upon the significance of the Christ-child for our lives and world today!



Congratulations, Vic Shelburne


Scouts BSA Troop 235, sponsored by Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, has been serving boys ages 11 to 17 in the Clemson area since 1963. Just a few weeks ago, Vic Shelburne was honored for 40 years of service as scoutmaster of this troop. He was recognized not only by Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, but also by the City of Clemson and many officials in local, state, and national government.

Vic was an Eagle Scout and experienced scoutmaster when he arrived in 1980 to join the staff of the Clemson University department of forestry. He soon was recruited to lead Boy Scout Troop 235. Under his leadership, Troop 235 has enrolled an average 60 scouts per year. More than 220 members of the troop have become Eagle Scouts, the highest advancement rank in Scouting. This is quite an accomplishment considering competition from other organized youth activities, increasingly busy family schedules, and distractions of social media.

Vic has ensured that Troop 235's activities reinforce Scouting's goals of learning life and leadership skills through community service and outdoor activities, while also having fun. Troop members annually complete an average of 1,000 hours of service to the community through groups such as Clemson Community Care, Pendleton Historic Foundation and the Clemson Experimental Forest.

Troop 235 remains one of the most active troops in the country. We are thankful for the forty years Vic has served not only as a scoutmaster, but also as a mentor and positive role model to so many youth in our community.
