

From the Finance Ministry


From the Finance Ministry

Through May, total income was \$468,870 while expenses for the first five months were \$381,743 for a year to date surplus of \$87,127. Expenses are at 36.6% of budgeted, while income is at 49%. As you can see, income is approximately 8% above budget while expenses are roughly 5% below



budget. Some expenses are lower than budgeted during this pandemic, and thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community and around the world. **Thank you!** If you are not present at Church, your contributions can be made by mail or online through the Fort Hill web site.



Wednesday Morning Bible Study in August

This August and September take time to join others on a journey to explore the Enneagram and glean insights for your own spiritual formation. The Enneagram is an ancient tool that helps individuals understand their motivations in life by examining nine different personality types. The Enneagram is "full of wisdom for people who want to get out of their own way and become who they were created to be," says Brother Dave, a seventy-year-old Benedictine monk, a mentor for Ian Morgan Cron. Cron along with Suzanne Stabile, co-authored *The Road Back to You—An Enneagram Journey to Self-Discovery*. Their book will be the focus of this five week journey that runs on Wednesdays at 10:00-11:30 AM on August 11, 18, 25, Sept 1, and 8, led by Mary Morrison. Brother Dave spoke John O'Donohue's "Blessing of Solitude" over Cron as their journey began together. These words are also my prayer for those of you who will join me in this exploration of faith and life together.



May you recognize in your life the presence, power, and light of your soul. May you realize that you are never alone, that your soul in its brightness and belonging connects you intimately with the rhythm of the universe. May you have respect for your own individuality and difference. May you realize that the shape of your soul is unique, that you have a special destiny here, that behind the facade of your life there is something beautiful, good, and eternal happening. May you learn to see yourself with the same delight, pride, and expectation with which God sees you in every moment.

In *The Road Back to You* Cron and Stabile forge a unique approach—a practical, comprehensive way of accessing Enneagram wisdom and exploring its connections with Christian spirituality for a deeper knowledge of ourselves, compassion for others, and love for God. I look forward to the journey together.

Call My Name, Clemson conversations begin in August


Racism book series continues with conversations related to our local context

After spending the last year learning about racism on a broad scale, from its origins, its terminology, its systemic patterns that affect all of society, the upcoming book was chosen with a desire to raise awareness within our own context here in Clemson. *Call My Name, Clemson: Documenting the Black Experience in an American University Community* written by Rhonnda Robinson Thomas is the next book for conversations on racism.

Thomas presents the history and reality that "Between 1890 and 1915, a predominately African American state convict crew built Clemson University on John C. Calhoun's Fort Hill Plantation in upstate South Carolina. Calhoun's plantation house still sits in the middle of campus."

Our church, founded in 1895 sits on a portion of what was once property of Fort Hill Plantation. "The church received the name 'Fort Hill,' from the former Calhoun and Clemson property on which Clemson College was founded." [*Country Church and College Town: A History of Fort Hill Presbyterian Church 1895-1995*, Sean Howard McMahon, published by Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, Clemson, SC,1995, page 28.] Thus, the story of Clemson and Fort Hill Presbyterian Church are linked in history.

Join Michael Steele, chairperson of the Inclusion Learning Action Team, as he facilitates these conversations of Thomas' account of the intersection of her calling as an English professor at the university and the driving force behind opening up the school and community to its hidden past. Conversations will be on Mondays, August 16, 23, and 30 at 7:00 PM. More details will be shared in late July.
