Message From the Pastor We are OPEN; Open Doors, Open Hearts, Open Minds

During the pandemic, we all were reminded that the "church is not a building, the church is a people" as the song goes. It is a joy to be able to gather in worship, learning, and service more and more. Indeed, the doors of our church are open. And we have been blessed with new friends in faith who are ready to venture out and be involved in a faith community. There are many entry points, open doors, through which folks might enter into our fellowship. You may have invited someone to join a class or a group you serve with. Others come to worship with us and get engaged. Some have a relationship with us through online worship. While we are giving thanks, I also want to highlight our Session's wisdom in appointing a Return to Church task force to guide us through these last two years. We dismissed those members on March 15, 2022. They have together prayed for the Spirit's leading while also following the science and information available to us. When we were weary or fed up or overwhelmed, this group just faithfully reviewed data weekly, met regularly, and prayed for you and God's people. Background

Over the last several months, the Fort Hill Presbyterian Church (FHPC) Session has begun planning for church operations after the lifting of our COVID protocols. At the January meeting, Session adopted six "Post Pandemic Priorities" (PPPs) to guide our return to "new normal," and the February Session Retreat started the development of action plans for these six critical PPPs. Work within the various ministry teams is now underway toward implementing these priorities during 2022, and these PPPs will guide most of our church activities for the balance of this year.

Six Post Pandemic Priorities (PPPs)

Our six PPPs were selected to enhance the elements of FHPC's Mission Statement, and they are:

Glorify God (Ruling Elder Mark Stokes leads these efforts.)

- Provide excellent 10:45 worship that continued to evolve
- Reimagine a 2nd worship opportunity (ad hoc committee)

Grow Disciples (Ruling Elder Pat Street leads these efforts.)

- Re-emphasize and re-engage the Fort Hill faith practices in daily life and events.
- Strengthen children and family ministry with learning opportunities to grow together in faith and practice at home and community.

Meet Human Needs

- Host major cross-functional fellowship and mission opportunities, congregation-wide. (*Ruling Elder Jim Thomas leads these efforts.*)
- Revive relationships, intentionally reconnecting members and creating small group opportunities. (*Ruling Elder Eddie Payne leads these efforts.*)

We are excited to begin our return to "new normal" in the post-COVID era, and Session will be bringing periodic reports to the congregation on our progress on these PPPs in the coming months. Please feel free to contact the Ruling Elders leading these activities or any member of Session or the Church Staff with questions or suggestions on how to implement these priorities during the coming year.

Christian Action Ministry Update

Over 60 Afghan refugees have currently been resettled in the Clemson area with the potential for more to come. This resettlement is being supported by the utilization of volunteers from area churches through the coordination of Tim & Jody Cross, and their organization Open Arms Refugee Ministry. Through such support, refugees have the potential to become successful and productive citizens, not just surviving but thriving in their new home. We are encouraging members of Fort Hill to join in this worthwhile effort.

The goal is to surround each refugee family with a Circle of Welcome, a small team made up of 8-12 people who will commit to walking alongside a family as they integrate into their new homes. Refugees have lost so much, but through interaction with supportive people, they can experience love, encouragement, and friendship to truly make them feel welcome and part of the community. Support is needed in teaching English, providing tutoring for children, enrolling children in school, helping with job searches, providing transportation for jobs and shopping, and even providing furnishings and clothing.

Christian Action Ministry is coordinating this effort here at Fort Hill, and will be organizing a meeting for all who are interested in supporting this effort. A presentation by Jody Cross and by some of those involved from other Clemson churches will provide more details on how we can get to know and work with these brave people. McCleary House Transitional Housing, Farmington, Maine

This transitional home will provide a warm and healthy place to live for 3-4 families or 6-8 individuals over the course of the year. Most guests stay just a few months. The renovated home will provide a safe space for individuals to begin the psycho-social, educational and vocational work needed to move forward with their lives.

Iglesia Presbiteriana de Lares, Puerto Rico

Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand, Lares, Puerto Rico

Following Hurricane Maria in 2017 and the January 2020 earthquakes in Puerto Rico, the Presbyterian Church in Lares has become the go-to location in the community for food, purified water and personal items. With much of the population elderly and infirmed, they rely on the church for help with necessities. With funding from the Birthday Offering, all appliances, wiring, lighting, and plumbing will be replaced and the facility will be made ADA accessible. Solar panels and a heavy-duty generator will be installed to provide uninterrupted electrical service and water availability.



From the Finance Ministry

Through the first two months of 2022, total income was \$245,853 while expenses were \$159,843 leaving a surplus of \$86,010. Overall expenses are at 14% of budget while income is at 24% of budget. Expenses are slightly below budget while income is above budget. Multiple giving units made their yearly contribution in January and February leading to the surplus.
