Message From the Pastor

Everyone Gets a Sabbath!

Oprah Winfrey is known for giving away gifts on her TV shows. You get a gift and you and you! If I could do that, I would give everyone a Sabbatical. University communities and Churches have this baked in for faculty and clergy. But not everyone gets that dedicated time away from being productive, being filled with renewal, rest, and God's Spirit. I want to be like Oprah and give a Sabbatical away to all of those in our faith family who after two years of working through a pandemic look exhausted and spent. I think of the working mom who is raising kids and caring for elderly parents who are struggling with mental and physical health after two years of a pandemic. I think of the medical technician who rose to the crisis, but then the world ramped back into hyper-speed, filling time with all the busyness of B.C. (Before Covid).

I think of life in High School and College terms. Remember that Freshman year was exciting and scary, but you got through it and even enjoyed some parts of it? Sophomore year was a slog. The "sophomore year slump" we call it. But the Junior year, it was the toughest. The Covid-19 pandemic is similar. We are in the toughest year yet for some. The effects of the last two and a half years are cumulative. An educator in our community who works with children shares that many kids and parents are not okay. Young adults have emerged into a world that seems less reliable at a difficult transition in life. Retirees seem to be doing the best but are supporting everyone who isn't. And some of our homebound and elderly members have really struggled.

Everyone gets a Sabbath! God built that gift into creation. It is a gift that we can unwrap and enjoy, structure, schedule, and set aside. Sometimes Sabbath is a walk on a weekday by the lake. Sometimes it is 5 minutes alone to be still and quiet with God — no words, just presence. Every week, we show up for God in worship — either online or in person, to be refashioned and remembered, put back together as Christ's body, and as individual beloved children of God.

This summer I will be going on Sabbatical as I start our 15th year in ministry together at Fort Hill Church. What a gift! One I do not take for granted. Session granted me a Sabbatical according to our Sabbatical Policy. I will be sharing more about this in the coming year, but I wanted you to know we are planning for this time. We will not have a Lilly Clergy Renewal grant as with Mary and my first time away. With the planning of Personnel and Program Support, the outstanding pastors and staff, and our ministry teams, all needs will be covered at Fort Hill. I look forward to time of renewal, recreation, and rest so that God can equip me and us for our mission. Thank you, Fort Hill.

Upcoming Wednesday Bible Studies: Prayer & Advent

Prayers in the Bible — November 2 & 9

The prayers found in the Bible are wonderful models of prayer for us today. The prayers of the Bible include deep human emotions, statements of awe and wonder at who God is and what God has done, and rich expressions of confession of sin and concern for the needs of the world. We can model our prayers of the Bible, and in many cases, we can use them as our own prayers.

The Bible encourages us, even commands us, to pray. "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Phil. 4:6). In the Bible, we have many models of people who pray, ranging from Moses, Solomon, and Jeremiah in the Old Testament to Jesus, Paul, and the apostles in the New Testament.


The Bible also contains a surprising number of prayers. Scholars have noted about eighty-five prayers in the Bible, and , in addition, many whole psalms and parts of psalms can be called prayers because they address God. These prayers are a wonderful resource for us. We can learn about prayer from them, and we can use them as our own prayers.




The first session focuses on prayers of praise and thanksgiving. The second session looks at prayers of confession and intercession. In both sessions, participants are encouraged to learn from the prayers in the Bible and discuss whether and how they might help one's one prayer life.



Christian Action Ministry Update

The Christian Action Ministry (CAM) has been working on some new projects this year and we wanted to bring you up to date on a few of the things recently going on.

A new ministry in Clemson that we agreed to support is the Shaw Center. This group is dedicated to fixing up homes of some of those who are threatened with being crowded out of their residences by developments that are gobbling up land for new projects. We are working on a home on Old Stone



Church Road that we are nearly finished with which will make it much more livable.

We will continue this ministry moving forward and we welcome anyone who would like to get involved. Particularly those who have some expertise in building renovation skills.

US-Mexico Border Ministry Came to Fort Hill



US-Mexico border missionary Mark Adams came to Tartan Hall at Fort Hill to share some Good News about his ministry on Sunday, October 19. Doing God's work in such a dynamic border environment is both challenging and rewarding. In the Aqua Prieta region of Mexico on the border with Arizona, Mark and his team lead a bi-national ministry responding in faith to the realities of immigration and the drug culture.

Mark shared stories of mentors in a drug rehabilitation facility providing opportunities for new life for persons gripped by addiction. In one story, Mark described a situation where recovering addicts were being paid a modest sum of money to tear down a portion of an old building and haul

away the refuse. The leader of the rehabilitation facility asked the building's owner if they could keep the shattered glass and tiles that would otherwise have been thrown away. After obtaining permission, the patients then crafted stunning mosaics which now adorn the treatment facility, providing joy and comfort to individuals on a very difficult journey. Mark said the leader told him that the drug addicts arrive at the facility broken, just like the broken pieces of glass and tile. In his mind, God helps them put the pieces together again to form something beautiful and useful in a difficult time.
