Luke: Jesus and the Outsiders, **Outcasts, and Outlaws**





From the Finance Ministry

2022 has come to a close and total pledge and offering income was \$1,022,035 while expenses were \$1,067,911. Other income (building use fees, special fund transfers, fundraising income, etc.) bring the year-to-date total income to \$1,142,667 providing a surplus of \$74,756. Income finished 2% above budget for the year while expenses were approximately 8% below. **Thank you** for making this past year financially successful.
