I am so grateful to serve a faith family that expects her pastors to rest, renew, and re-create for life in ministry. I encourage you to practice Sabbath, too. God says for us to keep Sabbath because that is the way God keeps us. Keeping us whole, loving, compassionate, and trusting as we worship God and rest in God's presence.

We have no Lilly Grant this time around, so I am grateful for the Session and Personnel and Program Support Ministry who have worked to make this possible. Our ministry moderators truly live their faith as they serve you and Christ. I am thankful for a capable and committed group of staff and pastors with whom to serve. Pastoral staff: Colin, Jacob, Mary, along with Preston, our parish associate, will handle the preaching and pastoral care this summer in my absence.

I must admit that I will miss you very much. I love you and will carry you in my heart. I am truly privileged to serve Fort Hill Church, and am so grateful for the honor of serving as your pastor.



Through the first two months of 2023, total income was \$265,897 while expenses were \$183,687 providing a surplus of \$82,010. Overall expenses are at 15.3% of budget while income is at 22.6% of budget. Expenses are slightly below budget while income is above budget. Multiple giving units made their yearly contribution in January and February leading to the surplus. Thank you for your tithes and offerings in support of Fort Hill.

# Feed the 5,000

We are all familiar with the miracle of Jesus feeding the 5,000 with loaves and fishes from the Bible and many of you have contributed to the local ministries through the collection boxes located around the sanctuary on Sundays. If you wondered how these funds are used, here is the story. Back in 1992, a group of volunteers began furnishing a Thanksgiving meal to those identified in need of assistance. This practice continues to this day, but has come to include not only this once-a-year event, but ongoing ministries such as Our Daily Bread and Clemson Community Care who provide food assistance year-round to those who need help with adequate food.

In addition to supporting these ministries through our benevolent budget, our own church has now joined in this effort thanks to our youth who have constructed a "Little Food Pantry" located near our College Student Center where those in need can come by and pick up food items. They are stocking it with nonperishable food that we can donate through boxes set up in the narthex or by using donated funds.
