
From the Finance Ministry

Through June, total income was \$625, 268 while expenses for the first half of 2024 were \$524, 627 for a surplus of \$100, 641. Overall expenses are at 44% of budgeted, while income is at 54%. As you can see, income is 4% above

budget while expenses are 6% below budget. 
