Message From the Pastor

You Are Glowing!

I had time with friends I have known since my college days. Scott, a Presbyterian pastor, said, "You have the glow of sabbatical." I realized that I was finally relaxed 6 weeks into sabbatical time. He may have been right. Or it may have been the North Carolina heat and humidity making my face "glow" and glisten. We say this to pregnant folks or newlyweds or anyone who appears to be happy. You may know folks of faith who have a glow about them. These folks exude peace, an inmost calm, and deeper joy. We see Christ in their lives, words, light. The Spirit keeps giving me the words of this hymn, "How can I Keep from Singing?"

Refrain: No storm can shake my inmost calm while to that Rock I'm clinging. Since Love is lord of heav'n and earth, how can I keep from singing?

One of my favorite discoveries this summer has been the "Pray as You Go" app. I have spent lots of time with God, praying, walking, listening, journaling, reading Scriptures, worshiping in interesting places. I spent time with God alone in the beauty of Creation, and even over a make-shift communion of juice and Pepperidge Farm cookies presided over by my Aunt Tricia. One day as I used my app, the music, Scripture, and meditation reminded me how God is always with us. The reading was from Exodus 34 when Moses comes down from the mountain. After spending time in the presence of God, his face shone. He was shiny, radiating, glowing. So much so that he had to put a veil over his face when he was with the Israelites. With God, Moses would take off the veil, completely vulnerable and completely himself with God. The chapter before we learn that Moses and God "spoke as one friend to another." God wants to spend time with us. God is a friend with whom we can talk or listen or just be.

Beginning with worship on September 10, we will learn about faith practices, one of which is "Pray Daily." I hope we will all expand our understanding of these habits that grow us as disciples and people of faith. Practices help us live in the presence of God in different ways, to see God in the world and others, and to be grounded in a God who loves us with an everlasting love, with Christ our brother and friend, and with the comforting and sustaining Spirit.

In a broken and fearful world, my hope is that we will all be glowing with that kind of light, drawing others into the Light of Christ's love and peace.

- For the joy of human love, brother, sister, parent, child, friends on earth, and friends above, for all gentle thoughts and mild: Lord of all, to thee we raise this our hymn of grateful praise.

May this be your earworm in the coming months as we rejoice and give thanks to God for all of his many blessings.





Through July, total income was \$753,756 while expenses for the first seven months were \$634,678 providing a YTD surplus of \$119,578. Expenses are at 53% of budget, while income is at 64%.
