# **Message From the Pastor**

## Do You or Did You Experience Post-Pandemic Burnout?

In January several of you shared an AP news article about US pastors struggling with burnout after the pandemic, and half considered quitting (<u>https://apnews.com/article/christian-clergy-burnout-pandemic-survey-24ee46327438ff46b074d234ffe2f58c</u>). Very kindly, our Personnel and Program Support leaders expressed concern for us by sharing this. Another member brought me a copy and said she always prayed for the pastors. I so appreciate this about the Fort Hill way. People are genuine and caring, and your pastors are most grateful.

Many of you, no matter your work, or family situation, personal health, or needs, may have experienced burnout, too. It is very understandable. I was most concerned for our church teachers, leaders, servants, who carried this congregation in so many ways, going the extra mile. I was glad to say to our Return to Church commission, officers, and ministry members, "well-done, good and faithful servant, now take a break!" And Mary and I were both able to take timely sabbaticals to be refreshed. I think we all did well at Fort Hill and here are a few reasons, I think:

- 1. **Presbyterians work by committee (aka Ministry Teams).** The beauty is that the work falls to a group to work, make decisions, and support each other. The church is better when we have many minds, hearts, and hands to do what God calls us to do.
- 2. **Presbyterians rotate and rest.** We have classes of leaders. Officers and ministry members rotate and take time off. Did you know that an officer can serve two consecutive terms but must take the 7th year off? Yes, a sabbatical. Just like pastors have sabbaticals around year seven. Rest and spiritual renewal are gifts from God structured into our system.
- 3. **Presbyterians practice "mutual forbearance" and trust.** We listen to one another and hear different perspectives as we make decisions and plans. We trust one another. We work together with humility, knowing we do not know it all, and everything will not be "our way" but we trust the Holy Spirit to guide us, especially when we are in crisis.
- 4. **Presbyterians value education and science.** We believe God gives us minds to use to glorify God and serve others. Science and education have been suspect in the current climate but our faith teaches us to value learning.

In today's world this is countercultural, even old-fashioned, some may say, but it is the model of the church as we see lived out in Scripture and with the guidance of those wise ones who have come before us. The Holy Spirit is really working in and through Christ's church as we follow "best practices" like these. I found myself weary during the pandemic, exhausted as we started with all the things, but energized. That is because Fort Hill has a wonderful staff team, is filled with loving, faithful people, and we trust God in all things — quite literally. So, thank you, Fort Hill, for the ways you live out faith and support one another. It is a joy to serve as your pastor.

# What Do We Mean by the Season of Lent?

An excerpt from the Companion to the Book of Common Worship (Geneva Press, 2003, 110-111)

What we hear during Lent is the power and possibility of the paschal mystery, and that the way of the cross, the way to Easter, is through death. To appropriate the new life that is beyond the power of death means we must die with Christ who was raised for us. To live for Christ, we must die with him. New life requires a daily surrendering of the old life, letting go of the present order, so that we may embrace the new humanity. "I die every day!" asserts Paul (1 Corinthians 15:31). Resurrection necessitates death as a preceding act. The church's peculiar Lenten claim is that in dying we live, that all who are baptized into Christ are baptized into his death. To be raised with Christ means one must also die with Christ. In order to embrace the resurrection, we must experience the passion of Jesus. The way of the cross, the way to Easter, is through death of the "old self." In dying, we live.

Therefore, at the beginning of Lent, we are reminded that our possessions, our rulers, our empires, our projects, our families and even our lives do not last forever. "You are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). The liturgies throughout Lent try to pry loose our fingers, one by one, from presumed securities and plunge us into unknown baptismal waters, waters that turn out to be not only our death tomb but surprisingly our womb of life. Rather than falling back into nothingness, we fall back on everlasting arms. Death? How can we fear what we have already undergone in baptism?

It is the power of the resurrection on the horizon ahead that draws us into repentance toward the cross and tomb. Through the intervention of God's gracious resurrection, lifelong changes in our values and behavior become possible. By turning from the end of the "old self" in us, Lenten repentance makes it possible for us to affirm joyfully, "Death is no more!" and to aim toward the landscape of the new age. Faithfully adhering to the Lenten journey of "prayer, fasting, and almsgiving" leads to the destination of Easter.

During the final week, Holy Week, we hear the fullness of Christ's passion, his death, and resurrection. From Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and on to the Triduum (Maundy Thursday, Good Frida, and Holy Saturday), all of Holy Week focuses on the passion. As his followers, we travel Christ's path of servanthood through the Lord's Supper and the suffering of the cross toward the glory of Easter, all of which underscores the inseparable link between the death and resurrection of Jesus.



# Lent Offerings

In the upcoming season of Lent, we will have two offerings for people within our community to grow closer to God in the season of Lent. We hope that you will take advantage of these opportunities, and take time for intentional study or community building here at Fort Hill!

1. **Covenant Groups** — This year our theme of "covenant" during Lent allows the opportunity for groups of people to come together. In these small groups, individuals will have times of "word-share-prayer." Each group will begin with scripture, then will have the opportunity to respond to questions together, and conclude with prayer for one another. Sign-ups for this opportunity will be available over the next few weeks!

#### 2. Wednesday Bible Study — PAUSE: Lent in the Psalms by Elizabeth Caldwell



"The season of Lent encourages Christians to consider a different pace — one of slowing down, noticing, pausing — than what our dominant culture values. The invitation to pause with the Psalms begins on Ash Wednesday, starting with a mark of ashes on our foreheads that reminds us that in spite of our failures — things we have done or failed to do — we belong to God. Readers are then guided into an exploration of Psalm 41 and the theme of a clean heart. Each chapter helps readers to connect an image drawn from that psalm, such as paths, faces, blessing, tables, waiting, thanksgiving, listening, being alone or abandoned, and hands, with their own lives. At the close of each chapter, readers are invited to try a

different prayer practice to help them continue to reflect on the theme and psalm each day. This intentional engagement — without feeling burdensome — opens just enough space and time for a creative spiritual practice to flourish, sustaining the life of faith during the Lenten season in ways that can make a difference in God's world.

During Lent, we will offer our Bible Study two times on Wednesday! We will have the Wednesday morning class at 10:00, and then the same class will be taught again on Wednesday evening at 6:00.

# **Choir Corner**

Here we are in February — the shortest month of the year! I am a February baby. I was born on the 13<sup>th</sup> between Abe Lincoln and Cupid!! Growing up, it always felt so special that people sent me cards with hearts on them saying that they loved me. I didn't realize that other people also got those cards, and it wasn't just for me!!



One of my most poignant memories as a child was right before my 7<sup>th</sup> birthday. My dad was working out of town in Abbeville, SC. He went to attach a crane boom to a piece of pipe for it to be moved. It was something he was accustomed to. Unfortunately they were working near many high voltage lines. As he went to attach the boom to the pipe, it was too close to the lines, and the electricity arched causing 44,000 volts of electricity to pass through his body. It went in his left hand, crossed through his body under his heart (fortunately) and exited through his right food. My understanding is that it threw him several feet into the air. My mother got a call and I stayed behind with my aunts. My dad was transferred from Abbeville to the Anderson hospital where we would be closer and he would receive incredible care for several months. To graph skin, they attached his hand into the stomach area and his right foot into his left thigh. It was a long process. My dad was disabled and could not work, but he lived to be in his late 70s. It was truly a miracle.

The reason I tell you this story is because during that time I heard a beautiful song being sung one night on the television. It was George Beverly Shea, a wonderful soloist with the Billy Graham crusade. He was singing "How Great Thou Art". I remember that chorus well, as I'm sure many of you do. It said, "Then sings my soul, my Savior, God to thee. How great thou art! How great thou art!." I actually sang that as a solo at my home church when I was 10 years old. It was our family's favorite and was sung at every funeral of my parents and aunts.

We all have favorite hymns that may bring back special memories. May this be a reminder for you to listen to or sing those special songs in your life that bring you comfort, strength, and God's presence. Music is healing and comforting.

Keep a song in your heart and keep smiling-n-singing.

## **Media Improvements Coming to Fort Hill**

Over the last four years, Fort Hill has invested in media capabilities in ways that might not have been anticipated prior to the pandemic. Among those was the introduction of projection and livestreaming to enable delivery of "inward care and outward proclamation." In continuing that investment, the Media Team has led a project to implement improvements based on identified needs and in response to inputs from the congregation. A group representing the primary stakeholder ministry areas and the staff was formed to collaboratively generate, review, and specify the project requirements and assess options. Two project phases have been defined, the first addressing improvements to support projection in the Sanctuary, installation of confidence monitors for those leading at the Chancel area, and providing the livestream video feed to the Narthex TV during the worship service or program. The second phase will focus on relocation of the systems' control position in the balcony and the addition and installation of cameras for livestreaming and recording. The delivery of the first phase is currently in work. These changes and improvements have been thoughtfully and prayerfully considered by the project group, and the respective ministry teams, approaching questions in open, honest, and respectful discussions. And at all times seeking for the proposed actions to enhance and deepen the worship experience a person might encounter at Fort Hill. As these changes come to fruition, the hope is that all will find them to be a blessing.

# **From the Finance Ministry**

2023 has come to a close and total pledge and offering income was \$1,075,670 while expenses were \$1,092,565. Other income (special fund transfers, fundraising income, prior year surplus, etc.) brought the year-todate total income to \$1,191,787 providing a surplus of \$99,222 (surplus of \$36,359 without transfers). Income finished 1.5% above budget for the year while expenses were approximately 9% below budget. Thank you for making this past year financially successful. Your ongoing financial support is needed for 2024, so Fort Hill can continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.
