## Message From the Pastor

March 2024

### The Post-Pandemic Era Declared!

In March, our officers rotate after the Installation and Ordination of new officers, and we start a new year at Fort Hill. Our Deacons and Session will have separate retreats to plan and prepare for the future. There was a time when we could not plan beyond that day or that week while dealing with the natural disaster of a pandemic. So, it does feel a little more normal now, and we have been preparing for a couple of years after covid turned the tables upside down on everything.

As we emerged from the pandemic, we have regularly communicated with you about priorities to rebuild and grow our ministry and mission. We can do all things through Christ, of course. But we cannot do everything. Priorities help us stay focused on core mission based on our communities' needs and the gifts and resources Fort Hill possesses that impact God's mission.

If you missed our January Town Hall meeting, Ben Trammell updated us on these priorities of which we are seeing the fruit. Colin Pettigrew described a strong core student group at Presbyterian Student Association and the beginning of his work with Christian Action. Much of our outreach ministry connects with Colin's support.

Mary Morrison, Associate for Congregational Care, described the formation of the inaugural Board for the Healing Bridges Counseling — a dream becoming reality. The startup board includes Hack Trammell, President, Robert Miles, Pat Clary, Stacey Miller, and Heather Cook. Our deacons are serving and building relationships. The new Mental Health Team is focused on training and awareness, while Healing Bridges focuses on counseling needs.

Jacob Kennedy, Associate for Congregational Life, gave an update on the search for a Coordinator of Faith Formation, a new full-time position to focus on children and younger youth, working with Jacob. Discipleship Ministry has been in a "Re-formation" season to organize for effective and fruitful ministry with all ages. Our ministry with children and youth is supported by many loving disciples who share their time and gifts to shape the faith of our young people.

By now, you have heard the news of Mary taking a new call to serve the saints of Foothills Retirement Community in Easley, SC. Her last Sunday is March 10. In the 10:45 worship service we will give thanks for Mary and have a reception following the service. We appreciate the manifold gifts Mary has shared with us and will miss her pastoral presence (unless you reside at Foothills). We ask God's richest blessings on she and Mark in this new season.

These are a few ways the Holy Spirit has been calling and equipping us, and our pastoral staff to fulfill the mission of Fort Hill Church. I am inspired by these pastors and our leaders willing to trust God and to follow where Christ is leading us. And we trust God in all the loss and change we undergo. As we have been hearing this Lent, God is a God who keeps promises and will be faithful to them. Thanks be to God!

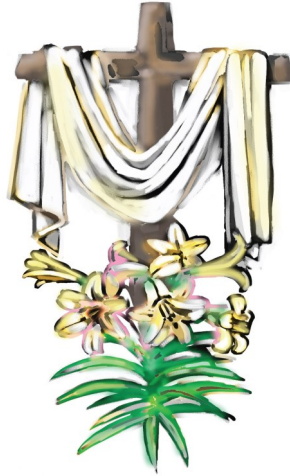

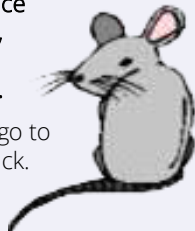
## Church Mouse
