## From the Finance Ministry


Through March, total income was \$352,531 while expenses for the first quarter were \$262,634 providing a surplus YTD of


\$89,896. Overall expenses are at 22% of budget while income is at 34% of budget. Expenses are slightly below budget while income is above budget YTD. Multiple giving units made their yearly contribution in the first quarter of the year leading to the surplus.
