Be Still...and Know That I AM God (Psalm 46:10)

The U.S. Surgeon General declared last month that parents are experiencing a health crisis.

"Parents have a profound impact on the health of our children and the health of society. Yet parents and caregivers today face tremendous pressures, from familiar stressors such as worrying about their kids' health and safety and financial concerns, to new challenges like navigating technology and social media, a youth mental health crisis, an epidemic of loneliness that has hit young people the hardest. As a father of two kids, I feel these pressures too," said U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy. (hhs.gov)

I see it in the faces and in conversation with parents, and I remember that stress very well. As parents, Chuck and I look back and wonder how we did it. We all have to set boundaries and structures that help our families thrive. I remember the conversations about when the phone goes up at night and how many activities our kids could take on. Lucky for us, our kids had no extracurricular commitments on Sunday and could be here in our faith community. I do not know how we could have done it without you, Fort Hill.

We believe that the God who created us in love, redeemed us by the grace of Jesus Christ, fills us with the Holy Spirit to live and breathe in us. We are called to BE. We are human-beings but get caught up in human-doing. We are called back to the presence of God, to remember the One who loves us and in whose presence we are fully known. Once we know we are beloved children of God, we can live fully in that abundant life Jesus offers.

We are created for abundance not busyness, for wholeness, not scatteredness. God gives us ways to be in relationships with ourselves, God, and others that help with life's challenges. So that is why this fall stewardship theme is "Just Be" the people God made us to be. As we are stewards or caretakers of our lives, our time, our money, our resources, we are called to be who God made us to be, Beloved Children of God. Everything else flows out of that identity. We belong to a faith family who helps us believe. In response to God's grace, we can be grateful and return thanks to God. And most importantly, for us to thrive, we get to be here to grow and serve. The faith is always caught rather than taught. We are here to help each other, especially those who are struggling.


Lighting of the Advent Wreath



From the Finance Ministry

Through September, total income was \$855,850 while expenses for the first nine months were \$819,788 providing a surplus of \$36,062. Overall expenses are at 69% of budget, while income is at 75%. As you can see, income is on budget while expenses are 6% below budget. Thanks to your financial support, Fort Hill is able to continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world. **Thank you!** If you are not present at Church, your contributions can be made by mail or online through the Fort Hill website.

Bridging Generations II Update: Through the end of September, total income was \$228,397.62 out of \$409,994 in total pledges. We spent \$180,000 of those funds to pay off the Building Fund loan with the final payment made in June. The balance and additional money received will be used for projects with include replacing the sanctuary 33-year-old lighting

system and updating the sound technology for in-person and on-line worship. Another project is the development of the outdoor space in the "backyard" that all ministries of the church can use to support their specific activities.

The Pansy Duke Scholarship

Scholarship Background:

The Scholarship has been established by Ms. Pansy E. Duke, a longtime and faithful member of the Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, Clemson, South Carolina. Pansy served Fort Hill as Director of Christian Education beginning in March 1981 until her final retirement as Parish Visitor in November 2015.

Pansy attended Montreat College (1956-1959), graduated from Flora MacDonald College in 1960. She then served as the youngest missionary without experience in the denomination teaching children of missionaries in Brazil. In 1965 she received her Masters of Christian Education degree from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education in Richmond, VA. She served as Director of Christian Education and Youth Director n Presbyterian churches in Florence, SC, Morristown and Nashville, TN, and Tampa, FL. Her ministry at Fort Hill fostered faith in children, youth and young adults as well as all ages of adults through Christian educational programs in Clemson, at Montreat and on many retreats and mission trips. She played the key role in organizing the first "return to Bethlehem" in 1990. Her love of discipleship in Jesus Christ is the foundation of the Scholarship to provide for supporting persons seeking to live out their vocation in Christ.

The Scholarship is awarded annually to qualified individuals based on leadership, academic excellence, and the commitment to explore means to attain a life of faith-based servant leadership. All qualified individuals with exceptional leadership and faith-based service, including seminary-bound students, are encouraged to apply and will be equally considered.

Strong candidates will have demonstrated a commitment to the Presbyterian Church (USA) and service to others. A limited number of awards are available each year. The Scholarship may be renewable provided a recipient is involved in meaningful ways in the life of the Church and in service to others and remains in good academic standing.

Qualifications:

- Active membership in a Presbyterian Church congregation or Presbyterian Student organization for at least the past two years
- Nomination/recommendation from a Presbyterian Church professional (minister or Christian education director), or a former or current officer (elder or deacon)
- Evidence of academic achievement
- Leadership qualities as evidenced by involvement in church, school, or community activities
- Evidence of service or ministry to others
- Evidence of need for financial support

Applicants must provide the following information:

- 2. Develop a statement of goals for how you plan to work toward attaining a life of faith-based servant leadership including past leadership and service-related activities.
- 3. Provide transcript from latest educational institution to demonstrate academic achievement.
- 4. Provide recommendation letter from Presbyterian Church professional or officer.
- 5. Develop statement of need based on your current financial situation and the cost for your educational goals.
- 6. Submit application with all documentation to the Discipleship Ministry of Fort Hill Presbyterian Church.
