## A HELPFUL APPROACH

The Mental Health First Aid Action Plan (ALGEE) is a step-by-step action plan to use when providing support to someone who may be experiencing a distressing situation, just as you would if you were administering first aid for a fall. The MHFA Action Plan has five steps, which can be used in any order.

- APPROACH assess for risk of suicide or harm, and assist.
- LISTEN nonjudgmentally.
- GIVE reassurance and information.
- **ENCOURAGE** appropriate professional help.
- **ENCOURAGE** self-help and other support strategies.
