

Message From the Pastor

The Greatest of the Gifts; Christ-like Love

Oscar Romero (1917-1980), Archbishop of San Salvador, was gunned down on March 24, 1980, while celebrating Mass. In a sermon in 1978, he preached of the Christian Community, the Body of Christ embodying love.

"People do not light a candle and put it under a basket," said Christ. "They light it and put it up high so that it gives light" (Matthew 5:15). That is true community. A community is a group of women and men who have found the truth in Christ and in his Gospel and join together to follow the way of truth more resolutely. It is not just a matter of individual conversation but of community conversation. A community is a family that believes; it is a group where each member accepts God and feels strengthened by the others. In their moments of weakness, they help one another and love one another; they shed the light of their faith as an example for others. When that happens, the preachers no longer need to preach because there are Christians whose very lives have become a form of preaching.

Love is the only force that conquers all. We seem to have resigned ourselves to violence and hate for groups of people. Our sin of greed and selfishness are celebrated as virtues. Bullying, lying, and demeaning language is the example set for our children. These forces cause spiritual harm as well as real harm to all of us. Only Christ -like love can overcome the world. It is the only force that can.

One way we can learn more is by hearing from a Civil Rights leader committed to the Christian faith and to non-violence. The Rev. Dr. Grady Butler will be with us on Sunday, February 16, preaching in worship. Following worship, a conversation in Tartan Hall with refreshments will be provided. You can read more about him on page 2.

May our community of faith embody the love of Christ to the world, so that our witness might draw others into the beauty of God's love. Blessings and Peace,

The Rev. Dr. Grady Butler Visits FHPC

The Rev. Dr. Grady Butler, a native of Greenville, SC will preach on February 16 at Fort Hill Presbyterian. He is a former pastor, including Nicholtown Presbyterian, instructor at Furman and Greenville Tech, and civil rights leader. He is a former Dean of Students and instructor at Morehouse College as well as at Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta.

He participated in Civil Rights demonstrations in Montgomery and Tuskegee, Alabama, and Atlanta, Georgia, and in October 1960, he was arrested while trying to eat at a restaurant in Rich's of Atlanta and spent several days in the Fulton County jail as a



cellmate of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He served as Secretary to Ralph Abernathy and has served on the Greenville County School Board.

For our purposes Dr. Butler will preach the gospel and bring his perspective to our faith community. Come here more about his experiences as a conversation with Grady and Vernon Burton, his friend of many years, in Tartan Hall following the late service.



From the Finance Ministry

2024 has come to a close and total pledge and offering income was \$1,097,155 while expenses were \$1,097,453. Other income (special fund transfers, fundraising income, etc.) brings the year-to-date total income to \$1,187,170 for a surplus of \$89,718. Income finished 2.5% above budget for the year while expenses were approximately 8% below. **Thank you** for making this past year financially successful. Your ongoing financial support is needed for 2025, so Fort Hill can continue its ministries to members, community, and around the world.

Bridging Generations II Update:

Through the end of December, total income was \$296,881 out of \$409,994 in total pledges. We spent \$180,000 of those funds to pay off the Building Fund loan with the final payment made in June. The balance and additional money received will be used for projects with include replacing the sanctuary 33-year-old lighting system and updating the sound technology for in-person and online worship. Another project is the development of the outdoor space in the "backyard" that all ministries of the church can use to support their specific activities.
