Message From the Pastor We are Easter People! Alleluia! is Our Song!

We are a few weeks from celebrating the resurrection. Before we get to the empty tomb, we have to go through some hard days with Jesus. The second Sunday of Lent, we heard Jesus compare himself to a mother hen who wanted to gather her chicks under her wings and protect them from difficulty. But every mother hen knows that chicks are vulnerable and sometimes go their own way. Wayward chicks are endangered by foxes lurking. This empty breasted mother hen is bereft and grieving because her chicks are scattered and in danger. Read Luke 13:31-35 again.

This is a season where we come close to our vulnerability and our mortality. We begin crossed in ashes hearing "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." We return to the Mother Hen who gathers us and shelters us. In life and in death, we belong to this God, a tender and fierce God. Returning again to God is an act of faith we repeat over and over. God in Jesus shows us the way of humility and strength, compassion, and sorrow. In our loss and struggle, the Holy Spirit will make us more aware of our need for God and for each other.

I hope that as we enter the story of our faith each week and in the season ahead, we read our script for how we are to live. Too many scripts have been offered to us, and we sometimes willingly play our parts. Too many times, rather than the Scripture being our lens by which we view the world, we bring the day's news, our own agendas, to the Bible. Stories of pastors preaching on the Sermon on the Mount and getting thrown off a cliff for it because their people do not like what Jesus has to say, are living by their party's script or some other script.

We read the world through the lens of Scripture and let the witness of God's work shape us first as people of faith. Then we are sent back into the world to infect the world like salt, light, yeast. Because we know the journey of the cross and our role in it, we repent and are set free to live as people of the resurrection. We participate in the crucifixion when we bring harm to innocent people, do not defend the truth, and do not live with fiercely tender love and compassion towards our neighbors. We follow a mother hen who suffers and weeps over us when we lose our way, but that mother hen loves us so much, that she provides a new way of life, defeating death, so we can live fully in the Risen Life of Christ Jesus, here and now. Saved by grace, we serve with that same fierce tenderness in this world.

Friends, we are Easter people and Alleluia! is our song. Keep going and keep singing.

Welcome Eric Meincke!

The search committee for our Music & Worship Arts Director position has been completed. The search committee consisted of Mark Stokes, Julianne Wenner, Chip Egan, Caroline Thomas, Lisa Britt, Wayne Madison, Scott Dillon, and Harrison Steele. Pastor Laura acted as our staff liaison and was instrumental in guiding us through our search and



evaluations. The committee vetted 12 candidates and in February made the unanimous decision to offer the position to Eric Meincke. Eric will begin his ministry with Fort Hill in May. We look forward to welcoming Eric on his first Sunday, May 18. Eric is currently serving as Music Director at First United Church in Bloomington, Indiana while working on his doctorate. His faith and love of music were nurtured by his home congregation, Second Presbyterian of Little Rock, Arkansas.

Eric Douglas Meincke will complete his course work in May as he pursues a Doctor of Music in Conducting degree and the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music in Bloomington, Indiana. During his musical career, Meincke has studied with renowned musicians such as Christoph Eschenbach, James Ross, Bevan Keating, Betsy Burleigh, Dominick DiOrio, Walter Huff, and William Weinert.

Eric has years of experience conducting various ensembles around the world, including as Assistant Conductor of the Second Presbyterian Church Adult Choir in Little Rock, Arkansas, and guest conducting appearances in London, Montreal, and Barcelona. Meincke also has numerous immersive experiences conducting ensembles like the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra, the National Youth Orchestra of the United States of America, and Cantores Musicae Antiquae at Florida State University.

Eric graduated with a Master of Music in Conducting from the Eastman school of Music and a Bachelor of Music Education from Florida State University (*summa cum laude*).

Meincke is also the recipient of multiple awards like the Career Encouragement Certificate from the American Prize in Conducting, the Arkansas Governor's Award for Musical Excellence, and the John Phillip Sousa Award.

Discipleship Ministry Update

From the Finance Ministry

The Finance Ministry would like to once again **thank you** for making 2024 financially successful. The 2025 budget was approved by Session in their January 2025 meeting. Income was budgeted at \$1,198,000 while expenses were budgeted at \$1,219,547 creating a deficit of \$21,547. As of February 2025, total income was \$243,947 while expenses totaled \$202,355. Your ongoing financial support is much appreciated so that Fort Hill can continue ministries to its members, the community, and missions around the world.

Bridging Generations II Update:

As of February 2025, total income was \$316,128 out of \$409,994 in total pledges. We spent approximately \$180,000 of

those funds to pay off the Building Fund loan with the final payment made in June 2024. The remaining balance will be used for projects which include replacing the sanctuary's 33-year-old lighting system, upgrading the dimmer switch station, and creating the ability to control lighting from the balcony to improve the worship experience. Another project is the development of the outdoor space in the "backyard" that all ministries of the church can use to support their specific activities.
